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PROCLAMATION



By His Honour, Major General, The Honourable Hugh Havelock McLean, K.C., V.D., LL.D., Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of New Brunswick,

WHEREAS, the Legislative Assembly of this Province, stands prorogued to Thursday the Nineteenth day of June next, I have thought fit to dissolve the said Legislative Assembly, and the same is hereby dissolved accordingly.

And I have thought fit further to order and direct that Writs for calling a new Legislative Assembly, to meet on the Twenty-fourth day of July next, be forthwith issued in due form, returnable forthwith to our Provincial Secretary-Treasurer at Fredericton.

Given under my hand and seal at Fredericton, the Twenty-sixth day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty, and in the Twenty-first year of Our Reign.

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Letters Patent

"SAINT JOHN Y'S MEN'S PROPERTY COMPANY, LIMITED"

Public Notice is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act (being Chapter 88 of the Revised Statutes 1927), Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer, of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Twenty-third day of June, A. D. 1930, incorporating David Gordon Willet, Barrister-at-Law; Cecil Rhodes Mersereau, Barrister-at-Law; and Adrian Bradford Gilbert, Barrister-at-Law; all of the City of Saint John, in the County of the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes namely:

To acquire by purchase, exchange, lease or by any other legal title and to own, hold, improve, lease, sub-let, sell, exchange, mortgage, pledge or otherwise deal in lands and buildings also personal property, and that of every kind and description, acquired or used in connection with the charitable and other objects of the Company hereinafter mentioned.

To erect and construct, upon any land owned or leased by the Company or in which the Company is in any way interested, buildings for any purpose connected with such charitable or other objects of the Company.

To draw, accept, endorse and otherwise execute and issue promissory notes, bills of exchange and other negotiable instruments in connection with the promotion of the said charitable and other objects of the Company.

To stimulate interest in charitable, philanthropic, religious, social, literary and educational matters in the incorporators and such other persons as shall become and be registered members in accordance with the provisions of the Letters Patent, or By-laws of the Company.

To promote and foster a spirit of fraternity within the said Saint John Y's Men's Club and other clubs belonging to The International Association of Y's Men's Clubs and through the friendship thus created to develop an active interest in civic and community welfare.

To hold, manage, operate and control either as trustee or otherwise any property real or personal on behalf of the Saint John Y's Men's Club or any other Club or association having similar objects and purposes.

To issue upon a resolution adopted by two-thirds of its members present at a special general meeting duly called for the purpose, as by the by-laws, rules and regulations of the Company are entitled to vote at such meeting, bonds or debentures to such amounts and payable at such times, and bearing such rates of interest, and containing such terms and conditions as the resolution may specify, and to pledge or sell such bonds or debentures for such sums, and on such terms, and at such times as may be deemed expedient, and to secure the payment of such bonds or debentures, to make and execute by its duly authorized Officers to one or more Trustees a mortgage of its real and personal property and assets, or such portion thereof as may be deemed expedient, mentioning the issue and amount, and the dates of payment of such bonds or debentures, the rate of interest payable thereon and the terms and conditions upon which the same are issued, the proceeds of such bonds or debentures to be used for the improvement of the property of the Company or otherwise applied towards the promotion of the purposes and objects of the Saint John Y's Men's Club.

To borrow money from time to time upon the credit of the Company: to limit or increase the amount to be borrowed; to hypothecate, mortgage or pledge the real or personal property of the Company or the shares of the Company or all or any of them and to give promises and agreements to give security for any money for the purposes of the Company by the name of "Saint John Y's Men's Property Company, Limited", with No Capital Stock but may acquire real and personal property to a cost value not exceeding Ten Thousand Dollars, with head office at the City of Saint John in the County of the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick.
