To acquire by purchase or otherwise, hold, develop and sell real estate or any interest therein.

In addition to the promotion of the game of golf, to promote the sports of tennis, bowling, swimming, boating and such other sports as may be conveniently carried on, on to the property of the Company.

To become a member of and cooperate with any other association or club having similar objects.

To buy, sell, and deal in all kinds of sporting equipment.

To raise money by subscription, and to grant any rights and privileges to the subscribers.

To establish and carry on schools for instruction in the various sports conducted and to charge fees therefor.

To issue paid-up shares, bonus, debenture stock and other securities for the payment, either in whole or in part of the purchase price of any property, real or personal, claims, privileges, licenses, concessions, franchises, or other advantages which the Company may lawfully acquire, and for services rendered to or work performed for the Company, and also to issue such fully paid-up shares, bonds, debenture stock and other securities in payment or part payment or exchange for the shares, bonds or debenture stock and other securities of any other company.

And it is ordained and declared that the shareholders of the Company may by resolution remove any director or directors or any officer or officers before the expiration of his or their period of office and appoint another qualified person in his or their stead for the balance of his

or their term, at any special general meeting of which notice specifying the intention to pass such resolution shall have been given.
