Notice of Legislation

Public Notice is hereby given that a Bill will be presented for enactment at the next session of the Legislature. The purpose of the Bill is to amend Chapter Forty One, 11 George V, entitled "An Act to Regulate the Practice of Optometry". In the following manner, that is to say: by adding a new subsection (6) to Section Three defining the duties of the Board; by inserting the words "subject to the approval of the Society" in subsection (1) of Section Four; by substituting the word "examination" for the word "registration" in line three, Section Seven, subsection (1); by changing the word "person" to "member of the Society" and deleting the words

"whether or not he is the holder of a certificate under this Act." from Section Eight subsection (1); by adding to Section Nine subsection (1) the words "or any person whose certificate has been revoked under the provisions of this Act."; by inserting the words "or offers for sale" in the first line of clause (c), Section Nine, subsection (1) and by changing the word "from" to "at" in third line of said clause (c), Section Nine, subsection (1); by repealing Section Eleven and substituting a new section therefore, whereby three members of the Council shall be elected every year and two shall be appointed by the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for five years, such Section also to define the duties of said Council.
