The following reduced rates of stumpage shall take effect as of August first, 1930, for the present logging season 1930-31.

For Spruce, Fir, Pine, Hemlock, and Cedar saw logs per M. superficial feet to be \$2.00.

For Spruce and Fir Logs, when used for pulpwood per M. superficial feet to be \$2.70.

For all other classes of lumber stumpage to be one-third less than the present rates.

The reduced rates of stumpage referred to above shall not apply to licensees who charge purchasers of timber from their limits a rate of stumpage more than double such reduced rates.
