By His Honour, Major General, The Honourable Hugh Havelock McLean, K.C., V.D., LL.D., Lieut-Governor of the Province of New Brunswick.

WHEREAS, Writs for a Legislative Assembly were issued on the Twenty-sixth day of May last, returnable forthwith, and the Legislative Assembly was therein called to meet on the Twenty-fourth day of July instant, I have thought fit further to prorogue the said Legislative Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued accordingly to Thursday the Twenty-eighth day of August next.

Given under my hand and seal at Fredericton, the Seventeenth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty, and in the Twenty-first year of His Majesty's Reign.

## Letters Patent

"F. & F. TRAFFIC INDICATORS,  
LIMITED"

Public Notice is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act" (being Chapter 88 of the Revised Statutes 1927), Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Ninth day of August, A. D. 1930, incorporating Albert J. Polkins, Book-keeper; Laurie O. Fawcett, Clerk; and Raleigh Trites, Barrister; all of Sackville, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick for the following purposes, namely,

To purchase or otherwise acquire any interests in any patents, brevets d'invention, licenses, concessions and the like conferring an exclusive or limited right to use, or any secret or other information as to any invention in relation to the production, treatment, storage, application, distribution and use of electricity and of any apparatus therefor or generally any invention which may seem to the Company capable of being profitably dealt with and in particular to acquire from said Laurie O. Fawcett, and Albert J. Polkins the benefit of a certain existing invention in relation to a new improvement in a direction indicator for motor vehicles.

To use, exercise, develop, grant licenses in respect of or otherwise to turn to account any such patents, brevets d'invention licenses, concessions and the like, and information aforesaid.

To carry on the business of electricians, mechanical engineers, suppliers of electricity for the purposes of light, heat, motive power and manufacturers of and dealers in all apparatus and things required for or capable of being used in connection with the generation, distribution, supply, accumulation and employment of electricity.

To manufacture and produce and either as principals or agents trade and deal in and with any article belonging to any such business and appliances, apparatus and things in connection therewith or any inventions or patents for the production or accumulation of electricity and electric motive force or other agencies similar or otherwise.

To manufacture, buy, sell, lease, let and operate any and all apparatus or machinery for manufacture, generation, storage, accumulation, transmission or distribution of any or all types of electric current and any or all manner of electric machinery, apparatus, appliances or supplies of any nature or kind whatever.

To manufacture, buy, use and sell electrical apparatus and machinery to dispose of rights of the sale of such apparatus and machinery or royalties.

To carry on any other business, whether manufacturing or otherwise which may seem to the Company capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with the above or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of or render profitable any of the Company's property or rights.

To construct, maintain and alter any buildings or works necessary or convenient for the purposes of the Company.

To pay all costs, charges and expenses incurred or sustained in or about the promotion and establishment of the Company or which the Company shall deem to be preliminary.

To sell or dispose of the undertaking of the Company or any part thereof for such consideration as the Company may think fit and in particular for shares, debentures or securities of any other company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of the Company.

To do the things as set out by Section 14 (1) of the "New Brunswick Companies' Act" (being Chapter 88 of the Revised Statutes 1927) by the name of "F. & F. Traffic Indicators, Limited," with a capital stock of Twenty Thousand Dollars divided into Two Thousand Shares of Ten Dollars Each, with the Head Office at Sackville, in the County
