PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act" (being Chapter 88 of the Revised Statutes 1927), Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Sixteenth day of October, A. D. 1930, incorporating Frederick O. Creighton, Merchant, of the Town of Woodstock, in the County of Carleton and Province of New Brunswick; Edward A. Caldwell, Manager, of the Town of Edmundston, in the County of Madawaska and Province

aforesaid, and Everett Ridley, Merchant, of the Town of Woodstock, in the County of Carleton, and Province aforesaid for the following purposes, namely:

To manufacture, buy, sell, import, export, exchange and generally deal in all kinds of automobiles, motors, engines machines, carburetors, accessories, parts and all kinds of machinery, implements, utensils, apparatus, lubricants, cements, solutions and appliances, whether incidental to the construction of motor cars or otherwise, and all things capable of being used therewith, or the manufacture, maintenance and working thereof respectively:

To construct, improve, maintain, work, manage and control any track or surface adapted for the use of automobiles, motors, engines and machines and to contribute to or otherwise assist in the construction, improvement, maintenance, working, management, carrying-out or control of any such track or surface.

To manufacture, buy, sell, import, export and generally deal in rubber, rubber tires and articles and goods of all kinds of which rubber is a component part, together with the various materials which enter into the manufacture of such articles and goods.

To manufacture, buy, sell, lease or otherwise acquire and deal in fuel-saving, mechanical and electrical apparatus and devices.

To repair, reconstruct and otherwise deal with automobiles, motor vehicles and any appliances in connection therewith.

To establish depots and agencies and to promote trial tests for motors and appliances in connection therewith, including carburetors and fuel-saving devices, and to offer for competition and distribution prizes in connection therewith.

To manufacture, buy, sell, and deal in aeroplanes, trucks, tractors, farm machinery, implements of all kinds, general merchandise and manufacturing.

To build and operate garages, service stations, motor vehicle passenger and freight service.

To conduct, hold and promote race meetings and athletic sports, matches of all kinds, agricultural, horse, automobile, aeroplane, and exhibitions and performances of all kinds, and to lay out and prepare any lands, buildings or emplacements for the running of automobile, motorcycle, bicycle, aeroplane, golf and all kinds of races and games.

To purchase and acquire and to hold, own and sell, with or without guarantee, the shares, debentures and bonds of any manufacturing or other corporation carrying on business similar to that of this Company, and to amalgamate with any company constituted for the carrying on
