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## PROCLAMATION



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By His Honour, Major General, The Honourable Hugh Havelock McLean, K.C., V.D., LL.D., Lieut-Governor of the Province of New Brunswick

WHEREAS, the Legislative Assembly of this Province, stands prorogued to Thursday the Nineteenth day of June pext. I have thought fit to dissolve the said Legislative Assembly, and the same is hereby dissolved accordingly.

And I have thought fit further to order and direct that Writs for calling a Legislative Assembly, to meet on the Twenty-fourth day of July next, be forthwith issued in due form, returnable forthwith to our Provincial Secretary-Treasurer at Fredericton.

## **Government Notices**

ORDERED:-On the recommendation of the Honourable the Attorney General, that the following regulations be added to the regulations of the Liquor Control Board

New Regulation

"Sterno," canned similar substances which, when in a state of liquefaction are capable of human consumption, and are intoxicating. are hereby declared to be liquor within the "Intoxicating Liquor Act".

10. Any jobber, wholesale or retailer dealing in Sterno, commonly known as 'canned heat," or any similar substance, shall at the end of each month report to the Board:

(1) a. A record of quantity received of of such Storno or similar substance.

The number of sales and the quantity of each sale of such Sterno, or similar substance with the name and address of each and every party to whom each sale is made.

(2) Upon the demand of the Chief Commissioner, or any other member of the Board, the books of any jobber, wholesaler, or other person or persons dealing in Sterno, or any similar substance, may be examined for verification of the reports made to the Board.

(3) Any jobber, wholesaler, or other person or persons failing to comply with the above Sections of this Regulation shall be subject to a penalty of not less than Twenty Dollars and not more than Fifty Dollars, and in default of immediate payment to serve one month in the common gaol.

(4) The Board may in the enforcement of this Regulation prohibit or limit the sale of Sterno, or any similar substance, by any person or persons, Notice of such prohibition or limitation shall be given by registered mail and shall be in the following or a similar
