D. 1930, incorporating Philip Watlock Allen, Departmental Manager; of the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick; Herbert Ivie Darby, Manufacturer; of St. Catharines, in the Province of Ontario; and Lillian Aileen Allen, Married Woman; of the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely,

To manufacture, mine, import, export, buy, sell, dispose of and deal in goods, wares and merchandise of all kinds, and without limiting the generality of the foregoing, to manufacture, compound, refine, purchase and sell bricks of every class and description, terra cotta, fire-proofing, tiles, drains and sewer-pipes, clay and clay products, chemicals, dye stuffs, cements, minerals, articles and compounds, separately or in combination, and under all conditions, and all stages of preparation and manufacture.

To carry on business as contractors, builders, roofers, importers, dealers in and manufacturers of concrete, cement, asphalt, sheet metal, roof preparations and other materials which can be used directly or indirectly by contractors, builders or roofers, with power to act as agents for other persons or corporations carrying on a similar business, and also carry on any other business of a like nature, or incidental to the foregoing.

To manufacture, sell and deal in Portland cement, and all kinds of natural and other cement, lime, limestone, calcined and other plasters and artificial stone, clay and clay products.

To erect, or acquire by purchase, lease or otherwise, manufactories, kilns and buildings.

To establish and maintain and operate manufactories, kilns, warehouses, agencies and depots for manufacturing and storing its cement and other products, and for their sale and distribution, and to transport or cause the same to be transported as articles of commerce, and to do any and all things incidental thereto and necessary and proper to be done in connection with the business of trading and manufacturing as aforesaid.

To manufacture, buy, or otherwise acquire, sell or otherwise dispose of, import and export, mine, quarry, excavate, open up and work and otherwise deal in gravel, sand, clay, limestone, brick, sandstone, building stone and building materials, builders' and contractors' supplies, plant and accessories

of whatsoever kind and description.

To purchase, take on lease or otherwise acquire any mines, mining rights and land in the Province of New Brunswick or elsewhere, and any interest therein, and to explore, work, exercise, develop, and turn to account the same.

To quarry, smelt, get, work, shape, hew, carve, polish, crush, saw, refine, dress, amalgamate and prepare for market ore, metal and mineral substances of all kinds.

To carry on any other operations which may seem conducive to any of the Company's objects.

To buy, sell, manufacture and deal in minerals, plant, machinery, implements, conveniences, provisions, and things capable of being used in connection with mining operations, or required by workmen and others employed by the Company.

To construct, carry out, maintain, improve, manage, work, control and superintend any roads, ways, railways, bridges, reservoirs, water courses, aqueducts, wharves, furnaces, mills, crushing works, hydraulic works, factories, warehouses, and other works and conveniences which may seem directly or indirectly conducive to any of the objects of the Company, and to contribute to,

subsidize or otherwise aid or take part in any such operations.

To acquire by purchase, lease, exchange, grant or otherwise, and to hold, improve, develop, rent, sell, exchange, lease or otherwise dispose of and generally deal in all lands and real estate of all and every kind and description, and all rights, estates and interests therein.

To borrow or raise or secure the payment of money in such manner as the Company shall think fit, and, in particular, by the issue of bonds, debentures or debentures stock charged upon all or any of the Company's undertaking and property (both present and future), including its uncalled capital, and to purchase, redeem or pay off any such securities.

To pay out of the funds of the Company all expenses in connection with and incidental to the incorporation, the promotion and organization of the Company, or which the Company may consider to be preliminary.

To issue paid-up shares, bonds, debentures, stock or other securities in payment, either in full or in part, for any property, real or personal, claims, privileges, licenses, concessions, franchises or other advantages which the Company may lawfully acquire for services rendered to or work performed for it.

To do all such other things that are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects by the name of "The Allendarby Clay Products, Limited" with a capital stock of Fifty Thousand Dollars divided into Five Hundred Shares of One Hundred Dollars Each, with the head office at Soudou, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick.
