And further notice that any employer neglecting or refusing to furnish such estimate or information is liable to a penalty not exceeding \$20 per day for each day of such default, and is further liable for damages, as provided by Part II. of said Act, in respect of any injury to any workman in his employ during the period of such default.

"G. E. TAYLOR, LIMITED"

To engage in the business of cold storage warehousemen, provision, butter, cheese, egg, game, poultry, fish vegetable, farm and dairy produce merchants, either at wholesale, retail or as manufacturers.

To buy, sell and otherwise trade in all the products, by-products and commodities incidental to or connected with the aforesaid businesses of meat manufacturing, pork packing and provision merchants.

To act as agents for manufacturers of such products and manufacturers as aforesaid.

To maintain retail stores, warehouses or sales-rooms for the carrying on all the activities of the said businesses.

To lease, sub-lease or dispose of patent rights and licenses in any way relating to the proposed business of the Company.

To purchase, acquire, hold, sell and dispose of real estate and personal property or every description either as dealers or as incidental to the purposes of the business.

To issue bonds or other evidence of indebtedness from time to time with or without security or secured wholly or in part by the property of the Company.

To carry on any other business which may be conducive to the objects of the proposed Company.

In payment of any claim or for any property assets, choses or good-will purchased or acquired by this Corporation, the Company shall have power to issue shares of the Capital stock to the amount of the value thereof, as fully paid-up and non-assessable, by the name of "G. E.
