

of twenty dollars upon each square mile applied for; and should the party so depositing become the purchaser at auction such deposit shall be applied toward the payment of the purchase money; and in case the ground so applied for shall not be purchased at the time advertised for the sale thereof, the deposit so made shall be forfeited; and in case some other person shall become the purchaser and comply with the terms of sale, the amount so deposited shall be forthwith refunded to the party who may have paid the same.

All berths applied for shall, if vacant, be advertised in the Royal Gazette and at least fourteen days' notice of sale given, and unless the whole of the purchase money be paid by the purchaser to the Provincial Treasurer at the time of the sale, such sale shall be void and the ground shall be forthwith put up again for competition between any other parties, the upset price being in all cases twenty dollars per square mile, and every license for a timber berth shall expire on the first day of the month of August next ensuing after issue of such license, but subject to renewal as stated in Chapter 11, 3 George V. 1912.

18. All Timber Licenses shall be subject to the right of the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council to increase the mileage on Licenses and the stumpage on all classes of lumber when deemed expedient, on due notice thereof being given in the Royal Gazette, such increase to take effect at and after the date of the next following annual renewal, and also to any further regulations that may be made by order of the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for the purpose of expeditiously enforcing the payment or adjustment of stumpage on any logs or other lumber cut within the limit described in any License or otherwise, giving effect to or enforcing the conditions of the License.

19. Licensees who have paid their stumpage dues in full and have fully complied with all the conditions of their Licenses on or before the first day of August in each year, shall be entitled to annual renewals for such parts of the ground held by them as may at the first day of July in each year be vacant and unapplied for, on payment of the mileage thereon at the rate of eight dollars (\$8.00) per square mile, payable on or before the first day of August in each year. That no renewal mileage on Licenses shall be received unless all stumpage dues have been fully paid as before provided; also provided, that no License shall be reckoned at less than two square miles.

Should any Licensee fail to renew any Timber License held by him on or before the first day of August in each year, the berths or limits covered by any such unexpired License shall be vacant and open for application by any other person.

BANTALOR GAME REFUGE

Public notice is hereby given that the following described area is set apart as a Game Refuge to take effect on and after September 1st, 1930. This area is situated in the Parishes of St. Mary's and Stanley in the County of York and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the York-Sunbury County Line as established by Deputy Wilson in 1913 at the intersection of said line with the southern boundary of the right of way of the Canadian National Railway, thence south westerly along said County Line a distance of seven and one half miles or to its intersection with the south western boundary of the Military Training Ground as established by Deputy Wilson in 1913 thence north westerly along said last mentioned line a distance of five and one quarter miles to

its intersection with the western line of Timber Block 12, thence northerly along said western line of Timber Blocks 12 and 11 and its northern prolongation a distance of nine miles or to its intersection with the above mentioned southern boundary of the Canadian National Railway right of way, thence south easterly along said right of way to the place of beginning.

Containing fifty nine square miles, more or less as resurveyed by Deputy Rutledge in 1930 and distinguished as the Bantalor Game Refuge.

No person has the right to hunt or trap or disturb game, fur bearing animals or birds found within the limits of this Game Refuge or travel upon it with either a gun or dog at any time. The penalty provided for hunting or trapping within a Game Refuge is \$300.00 or six months imprisonment.

This notice is given under authority of Order-in-Council, passed August the 11th, 1930, under the provisions of the Game Act, Section 84, Chapter 36 R. S. 1927.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING ANGLING ON WATERS WITHIN THE BANTALOR GAME REFUGE.

No person shall enter upon Bantalor Game Refuge for the purpose of fishing without a fishing permit which may be issued by the Minister of Lands and Mines subject to the following conditions.

1. Permit shall be good only between May the 15th and August 31st inclusive.

2. No fish less than 8 inches in length may be retained.

3. Not more than thirty (30) fish shall be taken from the Refuge in any one trip.

4. Fees. Residents \$1.00 for the season. Non-residents must pay regular fee of \$10.00 for trout license and must have a Woods Travel Permit.

5. Any person violating any of the provisions of this regulation is liable to a penalty of not less than \$10.00 and not more than \$50.00 for each offence and in default of payment to imprisonment not exceeding one month.
