

the estimated gross sales or turnover of a year's business shall be taken as a basis of valuation, and seventeen and one-half per cent thereof shall be the valuation for assessment purposes, provided, however, that the gross sales or turnover of the previous year's business may be taken as a basis of valuation, and in such case seventeen and one-half per cent thereof shall be the valuation for assessment purposes, and all bonds and debentures and mortgages or securities for money shall also be assessed at seventeen and one-half per cent of the par value thereof." Section 16. Exemptions, add following sub-section (11) Incomes derived from stocks in trade situate in the Town of Bathurst, of all classes of merchants and traders doing business within the Town of Bathurst.

And further, that the Act shall provide that sub-section (2) of Section 73 of the Town Incorporation Act shall not be applicable to the Town of Bathurst, and that the Town of Bathurst must provide for the relief and support of the poor of the Town, but shall have no right to make use of the present Alms House.
