Public Notice is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act" (being Chapter 83 of The Revised Statutes 1927) and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick bearing date the Tenth day of June, A.D. 1931, incorporating, Marion E. Stultz, Stenographer; Sadie E. Hoar, Stenographer; and Laura M. Reilly, Stenographer, all of the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To carry on the business in all its branches of manufacturers of, and dealers in bread, biscuits and other flour and food products including bread, biscuits, cakes, confectionery, breakfast foods and other food products of wheat, oats, buckwheat, barley and all other species of grain, cocoanut, cocoa, sugar and generally speaking all other articles used for food, sugar, confectionery and other sugar products, chocolate, cocoa and other products of the cocoa bean, cocoanut products, essences and extracts, jellies, jams and other similar products, corn products, paper boxes and paper packages, chewing gum or other business incident to the foregoing.

To purchase and sell the merchandise and products of any other firm or company.

To carry on the business of general biscuit bakers and confectioners in all their respective branches.

To acquire and take over as a going concern or otherwise all or any part of the businesses of any person firm or companies similar to the business hereinbefore mentioned, or any other dealing therewith, and all or any of the assets or liabilities of any such businesses.

To acquire and take over any real estate and buildings necessary and essential to the Company and to pay for the same wholly or partially in cash or wholly and partially in paid-up shares, bonds, debentures or other securities of the Company.

To carry on the business of merchants, manufacturers and dealers in paper made from any material, cardboard and other preparations, products and manufacturers of paper or pulp strawboard and similar preparations, products and manufacturers of straw, and to manufacture the same into boxes, bags, packages, books and any other articles of a similar nature, and to manufacture and deal in all material required for the same, and to deal in such manufactured
