Take Notice that application will be made at the next Session of the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick for passing of an Act to amend the Act incorporating the Fredericton Cemetery Company.

Notice is hereby given that application will be made to the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick, at the next Session thereof for the passing of an act to amend "The Town of Bathurst Assessment Act 1929" as follows: Section 2, sub-section nine, in the definition of "Personal Property" by striking out from the exceptions the words "bonds and debentures, mortgages or securities for money," Section 2, sub-section eleven, in the fifth line after the word "office" add the words "or doing business," so that for the purpose of the Act, companies doing business in the Town shall be considered residents, Section 15 Assessment of Incomes, sub-section one, add the words "except incomes earned by females less than three hundred dollars," Section 14 strike out the second paragraph and substitute in lieu thereof the words "In lieu of assessments of stock in trade of all classes of merchants and traders doing business within the Town of Bathurst, the estimated gross sales or turnover of a year's business shall be taken as a basis of valuation, and seventeen and one-half per cent thereof shall be the valuation for assessment purposes, provided, however, that the gross sales or turnover of the previous year's business may be taken as a basis of valuation, and in such case seventeen and one-half per cent thereof shall be the valuation for assessment purposes, and all bonds and debentures and mortgages or securities for money shall also be assessed at seventeen and one-half per cent. of the par value thereof," Section 16. Exemptions, add following sub-section (11) Incomes derived from stocks in trade situate in the Town of Bathurst, of all classes of merchants and traders doing business within the Town of Bathurst.

And further, that the Act shall provide that sub-section (2) of Section 73 of the Town Incorporation Act shall not be applicable to the Town of Bathurst, and that the Town of Bathurst must provide for the relief and support of the poor of the Town, but shall have no right to make use of the present Alms House.

Notice Is Hereby Given that application will be made at the next Session of the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick for the passing of an Act (A) to authorize the Town of Dalhousie to issue Debentures: (1) to a sum not exceeding \$30,000.00 for the purpose of enlarging the Town's water supply, redeemable in thirty years; (2) to a further sum not exceeding \$20,000.00 for the purpose of extending the sewerage system in the said Town, redeemable in forty years; in denominations of such amount as the Town may deem advisable, payable to the bearer or holder thereof, with coupon interest not exceeding six per centum per annum payable semi-annually, and in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Debentures Act; (B) also to authorize the Town of Dalhousie to erect wells and well houses on the public streets of the said Town, and to authorize and legalize the existence of wells and well houses already so erected on the said streets. (C) also to authorize the Town of Dalhousie to require heads of families, masters and mistresses of dwellings, hotel and boarding house keepers to make returns in writing to the Town Assessors giving the names and places of employment of all inmates of their houses; and also to require employers, foremen, superintendents and other persons in charge of factories, mills, stores, shops, offices or other places of employment, to make returns in writing to the Town Assessors giving the names, street addresses and salaries or wages paid to all persons employed by them.
