HIS HONOUR THE LEEUTENANT-GOVERNOR has been pleased to order, on recommendation of the Honourable the Minister of Public Works, that the following Regulations as to Gasoline Pumps and Refreshment Booths within

The Highway Limits be made and adopted:

"Authority Highway Act, Sec. 64, S.S. (1) Regulations as to Gasoine Pumps and Refreshment Booths within the Highway Lim ts:—

1-No person shall hereafter erect a Gasoline Pump within the limits of any Highway outside of Incorporated Towns, Villages and Cities unless permission in writing is secured from the Chief Highway Engineer or the District Engineer of the District in which such gasoline pump is sought to be erected.

2-No person shall hereafter erect a Refreshment Booth within the limits of any Highway outside of Incorporated Towns, Villages and Cities.

3—Any person in charge of any gasoline pump or refreshment booth now erected within the limits of the Highway shall remove the same within thirty days after receiving notice in writing signed by the Minister of Public Works and if such Gasoline Pump or Refreshment Booth be not removed within said thirty days after notice the same may be removed as directed by the said Minister.

Every person, firm or corporation owning, in the Province of New Brunswick, any sign visible from the highway, is required to obtain a license from the District Highway Engineer of the locality where the sign is located and to affix to the sign so licensed the tag furnished by the said District Highway Engineer, on or before the 1st day of September next, after which date all signs not so licensed and tagged will be destroyed and the owner thereof prosecuted under the Licensing and Taxation of Signs Act.
