Letters Patent

"FENETY MOTORS, LIMITED"

Public Notice is hereby given that

under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act" (being Chapter 88 of The Revised Statutes 1927), and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Fifteenth day of April, A. D. 1931, incorporating, John G. Fenety, Garage Proprietor; Beatrice V. Fenety, Married Woman; and Mary T. Mundie, Married Woman; all of the City of Fredericton, in the County of York and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To buy, sell, import, export, exchange and generally deal in all kinds of automobiles, trucks, tractors, farm machinery and implements and equipment, motors, engines, machines, automobile tires, batteries, carburetors, accessories and parts of all kinds of machinery, utensils, apparatus, lubricants, cements, solutions and appliances incidental to the construction, operation, repair and use of motor vehicles.

To buy, sell, import, export, exchange and generally deal in all kinds of radio and wireless receivers, transmitters, coils, batteries and all parts and appliances incidental to the construction, operation, repair and use of radios and wireless equipment.

To keep, maintain, operate and manage garages, service stations, storehouses, storerooms, warehouses and like places for the safekeeping, cleaning, repairing, servicing and care generally of automobiles and motor cars of all and every kind, description and class and of all the accessories thereof and thereto appertaining of every kind and description.

To manufacture, buy, sell, import, export and generally deal in rubber and articles and goods of all kinds of which rubber is a component part together with the various materials which enter into the manufacture of such articles and goods.

To service, repair, reconstruct and otherwise deal with automobiles, motor vehicles, aeroplanes, radios and any appliances in connection therewith.

To carry on a general tire and repair and vulcanizing business and to buy and sell in gasolines, oils and otherwise conduct a general service and repair station.

To buy, sell and otherwise dispose of, hold, own, manufacture, produce, export, import and deal in, either as principal or agent and upon commission, consignment or otherwise any of the goods, wares, products and merchandise dealt in by the Company.

To rent, lease and hire automobiles, motor trucks, motor vehicles and aeroplanes of all kinds and carry and transport passengers and freight in the same.

To apply for, obtain, register, purchase, lease or otherwise acquire and to hold, own, use, operate, introduce and sell, assign or otherwise dispose of any and all trademarks, formulae, secret processes, trade names and distinctive marks,

and all inventions, improvements and processes used in connection with or secured under Letters Patent or otherwise, of Canada, or of any other country, and to use, exercise, develop, grant licenses in respect of or otherwise turn to account, any and all such trademarks, patents, licenses, concessions, processes and the like or any such property, rights and information so acquired, and, with a view to the working and development of the same, to carry on any business whether manufacturing or otherwise which the corporation may think calculated directly or indirectly to effectuate these objects.

To pay the cost and expense of and incidental to the promotion, incorporation and organization of the Company.

To take over as a going concern the business heretofore carried on at the City of Fredericton aforesaid under the name of "Fenety Motors" and the assets and liabilities of any person or persons, firm to acquire and take over the whole or any part of the business, property and liabilities of any person or persons, firm or corporation carrying on any business which this Company is authorized to carry on or possessed of any property or rights suitable for the purposes of this Company and to issue, allot and deliver as fully paid-up stock shares of the Capital Stock of the Company as consideration for property, real and personal acquired by the Company.

To buy, sell, mortgage lease or otherwise dispose of real estate in connection with the business of the Company.

To do all acts and things that the Company may desire in any manner, connected with the business hereby authorized to be carried on by the said Company or in any connection thereof incidental, convenient or auxiliary thereto or calculated directly or indirectly to promote the interest of the Company or enhance the value of or render profitable any of the properties and rights.

Generally to do all or any of the above things either as principal agents or otherwise and either alone or in conjunction with others and by or through agents, sub-contractors, trustees or otherwise, by the name of "Fenety Motors, Limited," with a capital stock of Fifteen Thousand Dollars divided into One Hundred Common Shares of One Hundred Dollars Each, and Fifty Preference Shares of One Hundred Dollars Each.

The Preference Shares shall pay a dividend of Seven Per Centum (7 p. c.) Per Annum payable half-yearly which shall be cumulative and in a distribution of assets the holders thereof before any distribution is made to the holders of the Common Shares shall be entitled to repayment of the Preference Capital at its par value and any unpaid dividends accumulated thereon and the remaining or surplus assets shall be divided between the holders of the Common Stock. Preference Shares shall have no voting power and shall be redeemable by the Company at any time without the con-
