When any vehicle, motor car, auton le, vessel, boat, canoe or conveyat bile. canoe or conveyance has been forfeited to His Majesty in the right of the Province under Section 91. Sub-section 2 of The Intoxicating Liquor Act. or under Regulation 47 or Regulation 48 of the Regulations made under The Intoxicating Liquor Act, it shall forthwith be placed in the custody of The New Brunswick Liquor Contro Board. The said The New Brunswick Liquor Control Board shall within thirty days sell either by tender or public auc-tion the said vehicle, motor car, automobile, vessel, boat, canoe or conveyance. The proceeds of such sale shall, after the expenses of transfer, storage and advertising are deducted, be paid to the Pro-
