D. 1931, incorporating Charles Alexander Munro, Merchant; George Bowman Fisher, Accountant; and Alexander Wetherell Thorne, Editor; all of the City of Saint John, in the County of the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To carry on the trade or business of printing, publishing, lithographing, engraving, book-binding, book-sellers, embossing, stereotyping, electrotyping and any business of a similar nature, and to do anything incidental to the trade of printing and publishing.

Notice Is Hereby Given that the Town Council of the Town of Grand Falls will apply to the Legislative Assembly of the Province of New Brunswick, at the next Session thereof, for the passage of an Act authorizing the Town of Grand Falls to issue and sell debentures in an amount or amounts not exceeding thirty thousand dollars, in such denominations as said Town Council shall by resolution determine, bearing interest payable semi-annually at a rate not exceeding six per cent. per annum, payable at such time or times as the said Town Council shall by resolution determine, not exceeding twenty years from the date of issue thereof, for the purpose of improving and extending the said Town's electric light and water systems and for the improvement and reconstruction of its streets and sidewalks.
