WARNING

No person who is not a bona fide resident of the Province, and actually domiciled therein, shall fish for, catch or take in any Provincial waters, any fish, the fishing or taking of which is regulated by the New Brunswick Fisheries Act, with rod and line, in the manner known as surface fly fishing, without being the holder of a license so to do, which license the Minister may issue on payment of such annual fees as the Minister may from time to time determine.

No person who is not a bona fide resident shall be permitted to fish by license, with fly, for salmon or trout, during the open season for same, in the manner known as surface fly fishing, on any river, brook or lake, within the Province of New Brunswick, unless he at all time, while fishing, wear his official license badge, the same to be worn on the outer clothing where it can be plainly seen when angling.

Game Wardens are instructed to immediately report all violations of the above regulations.
