To sell and dispose of the undertakings of the Company or any part thereof for such considerations as the Company may think fit, and in particular for shares, debentures or securities of any other company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of this Company.

To sell, improve, manage, develop, exchange, lease, mortgage, dispose of, turn to account or otherwise deal with all or any part of the property and rights of the Company.

To act as agents for other persons, companies and firms doing a similar business.
