The Honourable The Attorney-General Reports and Recommends for the Infor-mation of the Committee of the Executive Council

That Section 3 in Schedule 3 of Regulation 2 as adopted on the 5th day of No-vember, 1918, be repealed and the follow-ing substituted in leu thereof:

ORDERED, On the recommendation of the Workmen's Compensation Board, that Regulation 1, under Section 45, 45-2, of the Act be repealed and the following substituted therefor:

REGULATION 1.

For the purpose mentoned in Section 45, 45-2, of the Act, classes mentioned in that secton are hereby arranged and all industries within the scope of the Act shall be devided into the following class-

Class 1.

Mining coal, including stripping operation; glass products of glassware and potteries; quarrying lime stone: crushing; burning; plaster manufacturing; mining other than coal; manufacture of brick; concrete block ;; tile, sewerpipe, conect. quarrying stone, sand, shale, clay or grav-el pits; stone dressing; marble work; or monument busines; boring and drilling oll or gas wells, including sinking of artea-ian wells as a business; diamond driving as a business; manufacture of oil from shale.

REGULATION 2

Where not more workmen than the numher set opposite to the names of an in-flustry mentioned in the schedules below are usually employed therein, such industry is hereby excluded from the scope of Part 1 of the Act, and is withdrawn from the class in Regulation 1 in which it would otherwise he included: subject, however, to any conditions attached to such industry or to any conditions contained in the schedules and subject to the other regu-lations of the Board, so far as applicable.
