REGULATIONS FOR FOX PENS OR RANCHES

No Fox Ranch, or Pens, shall be established or maintained, in Albert County, in which foxes are intended to be kept, without a written permit from Sub-district Board of Health concerned, and no such permit shall be issued by such Board, for the keeping of such animals within 100 feet of any neighbours inhabited house, centre of street or public highway, and in every instance of a fox ranch being obtained, such fox ranch or pens, shall be kept in a sanitary condition and in conformity with such regulations and by-laws, relating thereto as the Sub-district Board concerned may from time to time, lay down in accordance with law.
