Stenographer: of the City of Saint John, in the County of the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunsweik; for the following purposes, namely: To provide a skating and hockey

rink at or near the City of Saint John Saint John, Province of New Brunswick, I lay out and prepare such rink for

athletic sport and other purposes of the Company and to provide lavatories, re-freshment rooms and other conveniences in connection therewith.

To promote the game of hockey. To promote speed skating and other sports and diversions in which the art

of skating is involved.
To hold or arrange hockey and other matches and competitions and offer and grant or contribute toward the provision of prizes, awards and distinctions.

To subscribe to, become a member of and cooperate with any other associa-tion, whether incorporated or not whose objects are altogether or in part similar

to those of this Company.

To buy, sell and deal in all kinds of provisions, liquid and solid (other than intoxicating liquors) required by or con-venient to persons frequenting the Company's premises.

To permit the buildings or premises of the Company to be used for any purpose public or private, on such terms as the Company shall think proper. To raise money by subscriptions and

grant any rights and priviliges to subscribers.

To pay out of the funds of the Com-pany, all or any of the expenses of or incidental to the formation and organization thereof.

To construct, maintain and alter any cuildings, works or equipment necessary or convenient for the purposes of the Company.

To carry on any other business which may seem to the Company capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with the Company's business or calcu ated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of or render profitable any of the Company's property or rights

To distribute among the shareholders of the Company in kind, specie or otherwise as may be resolved in any manner deemed advisable, any property or assets of the Company, or any pro-ceeds of the sale or disposal of any property of the Company, and in particular, any shares, bonds, debentures, debenture stock or other securities of or in any other company, belonging to this com-pany or which it may have power to dispose of.
