

Officers before the expiration of his or their period of office and appoint another qualified person in his or their stead for the balance of his or their term, at a special general meeting of which notice specifying the intention to pass such resolution shall have been given, by the name of "The Forum, Limited", with a capital stock of one hundred and fifty thousand dollars divided into ten thousand class A First preference shares of ten dollars each and five thousand class B common shares of ten dollars each.

In the event of liquidation Class A stock shall be entitled to distribution up to Ten Dollars per share before any distribution is made to Class B Shareholders. If Class B Shareholders shall have received Ten Dollars per share any further assets in such event shall be divided ratably among both classes of stock share for share. The Class A stock shall be entitled in each quarterly dividend period to non cumulative preferential dividends if as and when declared by the Board of Directors from the surplus or net profits of the Company at the rate of Six per cent per annum and no more, payable quarterly on the first days of January, April, July and October in each year. If in any calendar year the Board of Directors in its discretion shall not declare the said dividends or any part thereof on the said Preference shares for such calendar year then the right of the Preference Shares to such dividends or to any undeclared part thereof for such calendar year shall be forever extinguished. Class B stock shall be entitled to vote but Class A stock shall be non voting with the head office at the City of Saint John, in the County of the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick, with power to hold any meetings of Shareholder, Directors and Executive Committee of Directors (if any) at any place whether within or without the Province of New Brunswick.
