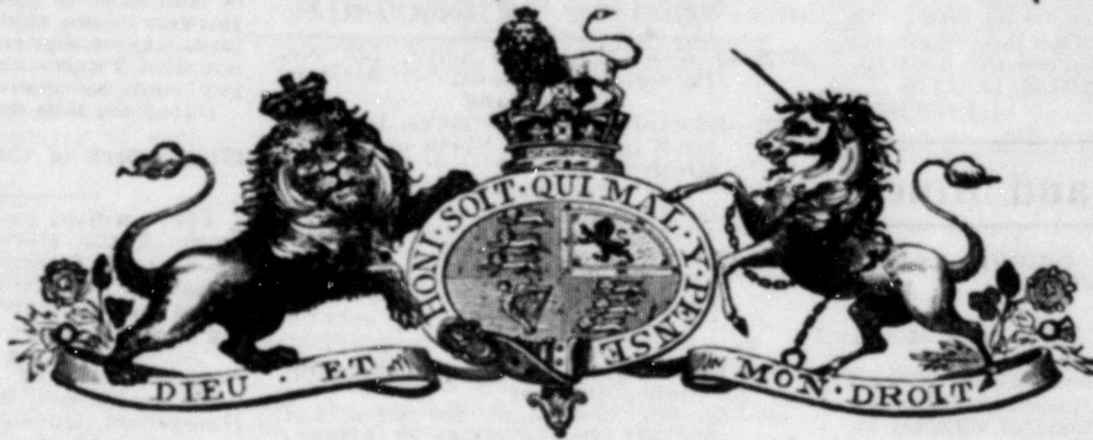

Letters Patent

"UNLIMITED SERVICE, LIMITED"

Public Notice is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act" (being Chapter 88 of The Revised Statutes 1927), and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Twenty-ninth day of July, A.D. 1932, incorporating: Reginald D. Keirstead, Barrister; Hendry C. McLellan, Student-at-Law; and Edith M. Givan, Stenographer; all of the City of Saint John, in the County of the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To lease and operate garages and service stations, whether separate or combined.

To purchase and erect garages and service stations, and to lease, mortgage or sell the same.

To trade and deal in, wholesale and retail, gasoline, motor oils, oils, tires, fruits, confectionaries and general merchandise of all kinds.

To deal in and sell motor cars and motor vehicles of all descriptions, and all motor parts and accessories.

To become agents for and represent other corporations and individuals dealing in any or all of the above merchandises, motor vehicles and accessories.

To lease, take over the shares of, or buy any business of a like description to that hereby incorporated, and to pledge or sell the same for profit.

To erect, alter, improve, repair, maintain and manage buildings upon any lands in which the Company may have an interest, and generally to carry on the business of a real estate and improvement company.

To pay out of the funds of the Company all or any of the expenses of or incidental to the formation and organization thereof, including expenses of permit to build and maintain pumps, or to pay therefor in shares of the Company.

To distribute among the Shareholders of the Company in kind, specie or otherwise as may be resolved in any manner deemed advisable, any property or assets of the Company, provided that the Capital of the Company is not thereby impaired, or any proceeds of the sale or disposal of any property of the Company,

and in particular, any shares, bonds, debentures, debenture stock or other securities of or in any other company belonging to this Company, or which it may have power to dispose of.

The Shareholders of the Company may by resolution remove any Director or Directors, or any Officer or Officers before the expiration of his or their period of office and appoint another qualified person in his or their stead for the balance of his or their term, at any special general meeting of which notice specifying the intention to pass such resolution shall have been given, by the name of "Unlimited Service, Limited," with a capital stock of Five Thousand Dollars divided into Fifty Shares of One Hundred Dollars Each, with the head office at the City of Saint John, in the County of the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick.
