## PROCLAMATION



By The Honourable Sir J. Douglas Hazen, K. C. M. G., P. C., Administrator of the Government of the Province of New Brunswick.

WHEREAS, the Legislative Assembly of this Province convened on Thursday, the 25th day of February, last, and continued its Sitting until this day, being the 1st day of April instant, I have thought fit to prorogue the said Legislative Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued accordingly to Thursday the 19th day of May next.

## Government Notices

The Honourable The Provincial Secretary-Treasurer Recommends for the Consideration of the Committee of The Executive Council:

That the regulations respecting the incorporation of companies by Letters Patent under the New Brunswick Companies' Act, be amended as follows:

1. The Honourable the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer is hereby designated as the Officer charged with the issue of Letters Patent and Supplementary Letters Patent; and the Department of the Honourable the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer as the Department through which such issue shall take place.

2. The signatures of the subscribers to the Petition for Letters Patent or Supplementary Letters Patent, or to the Memorandum of Association, shall be verified by affidavit to the satisfaction of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer.

3. The following is the Schedule of Fees payable under the 125th Section of the said Act:

On Supplementary Letters, when application is to increase the Capital Stock, the fee shall be payable upon the increased amount for which Letters are applied for, according to the foregoing scale.

In all other cases a fee of \$60.00. All fees must be paid in cash or by an accepted cheque, payable to the order of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer or Deputy Provincial Secretary-Treasurer, and must be transmitted by Registered Letter.

The fees to be charged upon the incorporation of companies by Letters Patent under the New Brunswick Companies' Act, Section 17 for charitable, philanthropic, temperance, religious, social, political, literary, educational or other like purposes, where there is no capital stock and where the cost value of the real and personal property specified under Section 17, shall be as follows:

Where cost value does not exceed \$1,000.00 a fee of	\$15.00
Over \$1000.00 and not exceeding \$2,000.00 a fee of	20.00
Over \$2,000.00 and not exceeding \$3,000.00 a fee of	30.00
Over \$3,000.00 and not exceeding	

\$4,000.00 a fee of 40.00  
Over \$4,000.00 and not exceeding \$5,000.00 a fee of 50.00  
And for \$5,000.00 and upwards the same fee shall be charged as for trading company. Also that the fee for one insertion in The Royal Gazette of the notice of granting letters patent shall be \$2.20 per square.

The Honourable the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer also recommends that the foregoing amendments take effect from the date hereof and all previous orders and regulations relating thereto be rescinded.

The Honourable The Provincial Secretary-Treasurer Recommends for the Consideration of the Committee of the Executive Council:

That the scales of fees provided in subsections (1) and (5) of section 11 and section 12 of The Theatre Act be repealed and the following substituted in lieu thereof.

11. (1) Every person attending a performance at a theatre and every person attending any place of amusement or participating in any amusement, as mentioned in clause (h) of Section 2 shall upon each admission or attendance or participation where a fee is charged for the same pay to His Majesty for the use of the Province a tax as herein provided and according to the following scale:—

Where the admission fee is not more than Twenty-five Cents, a tax of	.02
Where the fee is more than Twenty-five Cents and not more than Thirty-five Cents, a tax of	.04
Where the fee is more than Thirty-five Cents and not more than Forty Cents, a tax of	.05
Where the fee is over Forty Cents a tax of One Cent additional for each Ten Cents or fraction thereof in excess of Forty Cents.	
Upon each admission on a pass a tax of	.10

(5) The Two Cent Tax mentioned in Sub-section (1) shall not be charged against children, twelve years of age or under, for Saturday afternoon performances.

12. Upon each attendance or participation as aforesaid, where no fee is charged, pay Ten Per Cent of the charge for the meal or refreshment served to such person provided that nothing herein contained shall be construed to include the fees charged on any amusements conducted at any bazaar, picnic, or social held solely for any charitable or religious object.

And the Committee of Council concurring in said recommendation.
