retary-Treasurer is hereby designated as the Officer charged with the issue of Letters Patent and Supplementary Let-ters Patent; and the Department of the Honourable the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer as the Department through which such issue shall take place.

That the scales of fees provided in sub-sections (1) and (5) of section 11 and sec-tion 12 of The Theatre Act be repealed and the following substituted in lieu thereof.

(1) Every person attending a performance at a theatre and every per-son attending any place of amusement or participating in any amusement, as men-tioned in clause (h) of Section 2 shall upon each admission or attendance or participation where a fee is charged for the same pay to His Majesty for the use of the Province a tax as herein provided and according to the following scale:and according to the following scale: Where the admission fee is not more than Twenty-five Cents, a tax of...
