

The Honourable The Provincial Secretary Treasurer Recommends for the Consideration of the Committee of the Executive Council:

That the fees payable under Sec. 117, sub-Section 4 of the New Brunswick Companies' Act (called an annual filing fee) of Companies incorporated outside of New Brunswick, be rescinded, and the following substituted in lieu thereof.

"When the capital invested and or used in conducting the Companies' Business within the Province of New Brunswick during the past Fiscal Year was \$5000 or under \$ 5.00

Exceeding \$5000 but not exceeding \$10,000 \$10.00

Exceeding \$10,000 but not exceeding \$20,000 15.00

Exceeding \$20,000 but not exceeding \$40,000 20.00

Exceeding \$40,000 but not exceeding \$60,000 25.00

Exceeding \$60,000 but not exceeding \$80,000 30.00

Exceeding \$80,000 but not exceeding \$100,000 40.00

Exceeding \$100,000 but not exceeding \$150,000 50.00

Exceeding \$150,000 but not exceeding \$200,000 60.00

Exceeding \$200,000 but not exceeding \$350,000 70.00

Exceeding \$350,000 the fee is 20 cents for every \$1,000 of capital with a maximum fee of \$250.00

And the Committee of Council concurring in said recommendation. It is Accordingly so ordered. Fredericton, N. B., March 11th, 1932.

The Honourable the Minister of Public Reports for the Information of the Committee of the Executive Council;

That the Schedule of fees for Commercial Cars weighing from 2,000 to 4,000 pounds is now \$1.75 per one hundred pounds;

The Honourable the Minister of Public Works now recommends that this section be rescinded and that the rate on commercial cars of over 2,000 pounds and under 4,000 pounds be 1.15 per pound weight for the first 3,000 pounds and \$2.00 for each additional hundred pounds, or fraction thereof, and that this rate be retroactive to January 1st, 1932.

And the Committee of Council concurring in said report and recommendation. It is accordingly so ordered. Fredericton, N. B., March 31, 1932.

On the recommendation of the Honourable the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer that the fees respecting licenses for amusement assembly room, dance hall, concert hall, rink, athletic park, race track, tent, enclosure used as a place of amusement be as follows and not as heretofore—

In a village with a population less than 5,000, a fee of, (per year) \$ 2.00

And 5,000 and over a fee of, (per year) 10.00

In an incorporated village or town a fee of, (per year) 5.00

In a city, a fee, (per year) 10.00

BILL
An Act to Amend The Corporation Tax Act, Chapter 16, The Revised Statutes, 1927, and to Impose Special Temporary Taxation on Banks and Certain Companies.

Be it enacted by the Administrator of the Government, and the Legislative Assembly, as follows:

1. For the year 1932 there is hereby imposed as a special tax upon all companies transacting any lines of insurance and included in Section 4 of The Corporation Tax Act a special additional assessment of one-half of the tax imposed by said Section 4.
2. For the said year 1932 there is hereby imposed as a special tax upon each bank doing business in the Province upon the average monthly amount of loans, in-

vestments, deposits and advances as defined in Section 5 of the said Act at the rate of one-thirtieth of one per centum in addition to the tax imposed by said Act.

3. The Lieutenant-Governor in Council may abate or modify any of the said taxes and may also by order-in-Council extend the provisions of the two preceding sections to the year 1933, but no longer.

PROCLAMATION

In accordance with the authority given me under Section 42 of Chapter 32 of The Revised Statutes, 1927, all the forest land in the Province of New Brunswick is hereby proclaimed "A Protected Area" in accordance with the following regulations, namely:

- (1)—No person shall enter upon any area of forest land, after May 1st, 1932, until November 1st, 1932, for the purpose of travelling, camping or fishing or picnicking or for any other purpose without having first registered with a local fire warden or other person duly authorized giving him name, the route, destination, purpose and duration of the trip with dates, and having obtained a Forest Travel Permit. Such Permit shall be produced when requested by any fire warden or other authorized person provided that the following persons shall not be subject to the above-regulations, namely: Licensee or owner or occupiers of the forest lands travelled on, or their employees, or any fire wardens, fire fighters, land surveyors, licensed guides, or persons accompanied by licensed guides, or holders of hunting, fishing, prospecting and mining licenses or leases; or clergyman, teachers, pupils accompanied by Teachers, Scout Masters and Scouts when accompanied by Scoutmasters.
