An At to Amend The Corporation Tax Act. Chapter 16, The Revised Statutes, 1997, and to Impose Special Temporary Taxation on Banks and Certain Companies.

Be it enacted by the Administrator of the Government, and the Legislative Asrembly, as follows:

1. For the year 1932 there is hereby imposed as a special tax upon all com-namics transacting any lines of insurance and included in Section 4 of The Corpora-Toy Art a wareful additional assess. ment of one-half of the tax imposed by said Section 4.

2. For the said year 1932 there is now imposed as a special tax upon each hank doing business in the Province upon the average monthly amount of loans, in-

vestments, deposits and advances fined in Section 5 of the said Act at the rate of one-thirtieth of one per centum in

addition to the tax imposed by said Act. 3. The Lieutenant-Governor in Council may abate or modify any of the said taxes and may also by order-in-Council extend the provisions of the two preceding sec-tions to the year 1933, but no longer.

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PROCLAMATION

In accordance with the authority given e under Section 42 of Chapter 32 of The Revised Statutes, 1927, all the forest land in the Province of New Brunswick is hereby preclaimed "A Protected Area" in according with the following regulations, namely:

(1)-No rerson shall enter upon any s of forcet land, after May 1st, 1932, until November 1st, 1932, for the purpose of travelling, camping or fishing or pictic-for or for any other purpose without having first registered with a local fire warden or other person duly authorized giving him name, the route, destination, purpose and duration of the trip with s, and having obtained a Forest Traval Property Such Permit shall be proruced when requested by any fire warden or other authorized person provided that the following persons shall not be subject to the above-regulations, namely: Licenhands drawled on, or their employees, or any fire wardens, fire fighters, land suror any fire wardens, fire fighters, tand sur-panied by licensed guides, or persons accom-nation of licensed guides, or holders of bunting of hing, prospecting and mining licenses or leases; or clergyman, teachers, respits accompanied by Teachers, Scott Masters and Scotts when accompanied by Scout ?fasters.
