

(2)—Any person who is not required to secure a forest travel permit must when entering or travelling upon forest lands carry an identification card, badge, certificate or license as the case may be, and must exhibit the same and give information with regard to the route, destination, purpose and duration of the trip with dates when so required by any fire warden or other authorized person.

(3)—Any person holding a forest travel permit under Section 43, Chapter 32, The Revised Statutes 1927, or any person exempted by sub-section 3 of Section 42 of the same act, from securing a forest travel permit, who enters or leaves forest lands on roads, trails or other routes of travel where registering stations are provided and designated by notices, issued under authority of the Minister of Lands and Mines as official "Forest Travel Registering Stations" must stop at such places of registration and report to the fire warden or other authorized office there, giving such particulars as are required of the route, destination, purpose and duration of the trip with dates.

Penalties for non-compliance with the above, not less than \$10.00 and not more than \$100.00 or not less than ten and not more than thirty days' imprisonment.

The Honourable the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer recommends for the information of the Committee of the Executive Council:

That the fees payable under Section 117, sub-section 4 of the New Brunswick Companies Act (called an annual filing fee) of Companies incorporated under the laws of New Brunswick be rescinded and the following substituted in lieu thereof:

Companies with an authorized capital not exceeding \$5,000	\$ 5.00
Exceeding \$5,000, but not exceeding \$10,000	10.00
Exceeding \$10,000, but not exceeding \$20,000	15.00
Exceeding \$20,000, but not exceeding \$40,000	20.00
Exceeding \$40,000 but not exceeding \$60,000	25.00
Exceeding \$60,000, but not exceeding \$80,000	30.00
Exceeding \$80,000, but not exceeding \$100,000	40.00
Exceeding \$100,000, but not exceeding \$150,000	50.00
Exceeding \$150,000, but not exceeding \$200,000	60.00
Exceeding \$200,000, but not exceeding \$350,000	70.00
Companies with authorized capital exceeding \$350,000, the fee is 20 cents for every \$1,000 of capital with a maximum fee of	250.00

When the whole or part of the stock of a Company consists of shares without nominal or par value, each such share shall, for the purpose of ascertaining the fee payable upon such return, be reckoned as having a par value equal to the maximum amount for which a share might be issued or allotted during the year preceding the date of such return, and the total value of all such shares thus ascertained shall be considered as forming the whole or part of the authorized capital, as the case may be.

The Honourable the Minister of Public Works reports for the information of the Committee of the Executive Council:

That the fees for Motor Carriers for the Calendar year 1932, be as follows:

"On all Motor Carriers, carrying passengers only, the fee be 2 per cent. of the gross earnings, payable not later than the twentieth of each month for the preceding month's business.

On all Motor carriers carrying freight only, the fee be as follows:

On each and every truck weighing 3,000 pounds or less without load a lump sum of \$25.00.

On each and every truck weighing over 3,000 pounds or less than 4,000 pounds a lump sum of \$50.00.

On each and every truck weighing 4,000 pounds or over a lump sum fee of \$100.00.

Such fee to be payable in advance before a certificate is issued by the Board."

And the Committee of Council concurring in said report and recommendation.

The Honourable The Minister of Public Works reports for the information of the Committee of the Executive Council:

That by Chapter 26 of the Revised Statutes of New Brunswick, 1927, respecting motor vehicles, the fees to be paid to the Department are fixed by Schedule A. of said Chapter;

That by Section 29 of said Chapter it is provided that the fees in Schedule A. may be altered from time to time by Order-in-Council;

That the said Schedule A. was altered and amended by Orders-in-Council dated December 11th, 1928 and March 26th, 1931, respectively;

The Honourable the Minister of Public Works now recommends that said Schedule A. may be altered or amended to read as follows:

entirely with pneumatic tires at the rate of \$1.15 per one hundred pounds for weight of vehicle up to 3,000 pounds; at the rate of \$1.75 per one hundred pounds for weight of vehicle from 3,000 to 4,000 pounds; at the rate of \$2.00 per one hundred pounds for weight of vehicle from 4,000 to 6,000 pounds; at the rate of \$2.50 per one hundred pounds for weight of vehicle from 6,000 pounds and up. For a Commercial vehicle equipped entirely or in part with other than pneumatic tires at the rate of \$1.75 per one hundred pounds for weight of vehicle up to 3,000 pounds; at the rate of \$2.50 per one hundred pounds for weight of vehicle up to 6,000 pounds; at the rate of \$3.00 per one hundred pounds for weight of vehicle up to or over 8,000 pounds.

Trucks or commercial vehicles entering New Brunswick, which have been duly licensed in their Province or State, the fees to be come as above, but a permit may be given good for one month at one quarter regular rates plus registration fee.

For each Service Crane 25.00

"Service Crane"—a motor truck used by Dealers and Garages, equipped with a hoisting crane, and used for repair work only.

Annual License Fee for all other motor vehicles a sum equal to ninety cents for each one hundred pounds weight or fraction thereof.

The above fees to be retroactive from January 1st, A. D. 1932.

And the Committee of Council concurring in said report and recommendation.

The Honourable The Minister of Public Works Reports for the Information of The Committee of The Executive Council:

That under and by virtue of Section 3 of Chapter 22 of The Revised Statutes of New Brunswick (1927), "The Gasoline Tax Act," as amended by Chapter 29 of the Acts of Assembly 18 George V., 1928, and as further amended at the present session of the Legislative Assembly, it is provided that every purchaser shall pay to the Provincial Treasurer for the use of His Majesty in right of the Province, a tax at such rate not exceeding seven cents a gallon as the Governor-in-Council may from time to time determine on all gasoline purchased by or delivered to such purchaser.

The Honourable the Minister of Public Works now recommends that on, from and after the first day of April, A. D. 1932, the rate of such tax be fixed and determined at seven cents per gallon.
