Rules and Practice Regarding Private Bills

The attention of parties intending to seek the passage of Private Bills at the past Session of the Legislative Assembly is directed to the following rules.

71. Private Bills shall be introduced to the following rules.

No Private Bill, or Bill making y amendment of a like nature to a mer Act, shall be received by the use, unless a notice, specifying clear,

ly and distinctly the nature and objects thereof, has been published at least once a week for three successive weeks previous to the meeting of the Legislature, or to the introduction of the Bill, in some one of the newspapers published in the county interested in or to be affect. in the county interested in or to be affected by the measure, or in the locality where the parties affected, or the major-ity of them, reside; and when no news-paper is published in such county or locality, then in some newspaper having general circulation in such county or locality, and also in the Royal Gazette. When the city or county interested in the measure, or in the locality in which the parties affected reside, is largely com-posed of a French population, then such notice shall also be published in a French newspaper, if any be published in the

In any county where no newspaper may be published, the Bill, in lieu of other local publication, may be read at any Circuit or County Court in the presence of the Grand Jury, or before the Municipal Council of the county interested in or affected by the Bill; and a certificate of such reading shall be indorsed thereon, or attached to, the said Bill, by the Clerk of the Court, or the Town Clerk, or the Secretary-Treasurer, as the case may be verified by the seal (if any) of the Court, Town Council, or Municipal Council, as the case may be; and separate petitions must be presented to the House, setting forth in detail the object of the measure, and the reasons that may be urged for its adoption.

80. When any Bill affects civil or municipal interests, a notice distinctly specifying the purposes and objects of the Bill shall, at least one week before the introduction of such Bill into the House, be delivered to the Secretary-Treasurer of the County or to the Clerk of the City or Town which may be affected. paper may be published, the Bill, in lieu of other local publication, may be read at

81. Proof that the requirements of the three last preceding Rules have been complied with, shall be by affidavit or statutory declaration, and it shall be the duty of all parties seeking to promote the passage of any private Bill to file with the Clerk of the House the evidence of

82. In default of such proof or evidence being so furnished, it shall be the duty of the Clerk to report to Mr. Speaker, or the House and to endorse upon the Bill, that the Rules and Standing Orders have not been complied with. 84. No Private or Local Bill shall be

Upon incorporation of Companies having a stated capital, or amendments increasing capital, an additional fee equaling the fee payable under the N.B. Joint Stock Companies' Act.

A page for the purposes of this Rule, shal limean not exceeding 500 words.
