D. 1932, incorporating: Percy D. Ayer, Manufacturer; James E. Masters, Insurance Broker; and Amasa J. Tingley, Chief of Police Canadian National Railways; all of the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To acquire and take over the business heretofore carried on at the City of Moncton by the "Maritime Press, Limited" (assuming its debts and obligations), and to pay for the same by issuing fully paid-up Shares of this Company.

To buy and sell advertising space or privileges and to acquire and operate franchises for the purposes of advertising or for the buying or selling of advertising privileges and generally to carry on a general advertising business as advertising contractors and agents, and as such to carry on a general promotion and agency business in connection with advertising of all kinds.

To manufacture, buy, sell and deal in every kind and description of sign, show card, novelty, label, name, plate, badge, button calendar or other device and generally in specialties of all kinds to be used in advertising for commercial and other purposes.
