Re. Sale of Extracts in the Parishes of Newcastle and Chatham, County of Northumberland, Province of New Brunswick—

By virtue of a Resolution passed at the regular monthly meeting of The New Brunswick Liquor Control Board, held on the 17th day of August, 1932, the following Order was made:

"Under the authority of Section 53A Sub-section 1 of The Intoxicating Liquor Act The New Brunswick Liquor Control Board herewith orders that no essence, tincture, compound or preparation commonly known or described as a flavoring extract or essence containing alcohol shall be sold in the Parish of Newcastle, including the Town of Newcastle, or the Parish of Chatham, including the Town of Chatham, except in bottles containing not more than two ounces. Such sale shall be limited to one two-ounce bottle per day to any one person. This Order shall become effective on and after October 1st, 1932."

Penalty—Section 53A Sub-section 4 of The Intoxicating Liquor Act:—

"Any person violating any of the provisions of this Section shall be subject to a penalty of not less than Twenty Dollars nor more than One Hundred Dollars, and in default of payment of such fine and the costs shall be imprisoned for a period of thirty days."

"PORTERS, LIMITED"

Public Notice is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act" (being Chapter 88 of The Revised Statutes 1927), and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Twenty-ninth day of September, A.D. 1932, incorporating: Guy G. Porter, Merchant; James E. Porter, Merchant; and Newton A. Rogers, Accountant; all of Perth, in the County of Victoria, and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase, deal in, produce and sell, at wholesale and retail, both as principal and agent, all kinds of agricultural prod-

ucts, horses, cattle and other live stock, goods, wares, merchandise, fertilizers, farm implements, machinery, carriages, waggons, sleighs, sleds, meats and food-stuffs, automobiles and automobile parts, repairs and accessories.

To carry on a general mercantile and trading business and to buy, sell and deal in all kinds of goods and classes of goods incidental thereto.

To carry on any other business (whether manufacturing or otherwise) which may seem to the Company capable of being conveniently and profitably carried on in connection with the above, or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of the Company's property or rights.

For the purposes aforesaid, to purchase, lease or otherwise acquire real estate and buildings.

For the purposes aforesaid to build, purchase, own and operate starch factories, warehouses, grist mills, saw mills, barrel and box factories, dwelling houses and stores.

For the purposes aforesaid to charter, purchase, own and operate steamships and sailing vessels.

To mortgage, pledge, encumber, sell or otherwise dispose of the undertaking of the Company or any part thereof and any or all of the real estate and personal property of the Company for such consideration and in such manner and upon such terms as to the Company may seem desirable.

To do all things necessary, proper, suitable or convenient for the accomplishment of any of the purposes or the attainment of any one or more of the objects herein enumerated or incidental to the powers herein named or which shall at any time appear conducive or expedient to or for the protection or benefit of the Company either as holders of or as interested in any property or otherwise to the same extent and as fully as natural persons might or could do, by the name of "Porters, Limited," with a capital stock of Ten Thousand Dollars divided into One Hundred Shares of One Hundred Dollars Each, with the Head Office at Perth, in the County of Victoria and Province of New Brunswick.
