Letters Patent

"MONCTON TAXI, LIMITED"

Public Notice is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act" (being Chapter 88 of The Revised Statutes 1927) and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick bearing date the Twenty-third day of July, A.D. 1932, incorporating: Harry Ruch, Merchant; Morris H. Nelson, Taxi Operator; both of the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick; and H. Murray Lambert, Barrister; of the Town of Sunny Brae, in the County of Westmorland and Province aforesaid, for the following purposes, namely:

To carry on a general taxi business, including the carrying of passengers and their baggage for pay either by motor vehicle, horse-drawn carriages, sleds, sleighs or otherwise; to let out motor cars for hire and generally to carry on all such business as is usually carried on in connection with a general taxi business.

To acquire any other business similar to its own and to take shares and securities in other companies.

To enter into agreements for sharing profits, joint adventure, reciprocal concessions or other arrangements of a like nature with other persons firms or companies carrying on a similar business.

To draw accept, make, endorse, issue,

discount, etc., cheques, bills of exchange, bills of lading, promissory notes and all other negotiable instruments.

To purchase, take on lease, or in exchange, hire, or otherwise acquire any real estate or personal property, and any rights in any real estate or personal property that the Company may think necessary or convenient for the purpose of its business.

To sell and dispose of the undertaking of the Company for shares, debentures or securities of any other company having objects all together or in part, similar to those of the Company.

To sell, improve, manage, develop, exchange, lease, dispose of, turn to account, or otherwise deal with all or any part of the property and rights of the Company.

To borrow money and to pledge any of the property of the Company, whether real or personal, as security for the same by mortgages, bills of sale, or otherwise.

To do all the things above mentioned or any other thing authorized by the "New Brunswick Companies' Act," either as principals, agents, contractors, trustees or otherwise and either alone or in conjunction with others.

To do all such other things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of any of the objects set out in Letters Patent or authorized by the New Brunswick Companies' Act," by the name of "Moncton Taxi, Limited," with a capital stock of Five Thousand Dollars divided into One Hundred Shares of Fifty Dollars Each, with the head office at the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick.
