"Tenders for Lumber for Hampton Village Bridge, Kings County, N. B." will be received at the Department of Public Works, Fredericton, N. B., until Friday, The 18th Day of March, 1932, at 5 O'clock, P. M.

This specification to be seen at the Public Works Department, Fredericton, N. B.

Each tender must be accompanied by a Certified Bank Cheque, made payable to the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer, or Cash, for an amount equal to five per cent of the tender, which will be forfeited if the party tendering declines to enter into contract when called upon. Such Certified Bank Cheque or Cash will be returned to the parties whose tenders are not accepted, but with the party to whom the contract is awarded, it shall be retained until the final completion of the contract and its acceptance by the Department. Not obliged to accept lowest or any tender.

Specification For Material

All material shall be delivered at the site of bridge, where it shall be carefully culled by the officer duly appointed to oversee the same.

Such material shall be piled in such suitable and convenient manner to be easily accessible for such inspection and culling.

The officer in charge shall refuse to inspect the same until such material is so suitably arranged, and any expense caused the Department by such delay shall be deducted from the contract price for lumber.

All condemned material shall be at once removed away entirely from such accepted material and the bridge site generally.

The material throughout to be of best quality of its respective kind. It shall be of a large, free from sap, growth, straight grained, free from large or loose knots, wane edges, through or round shakes, large or through season cracks, decay, mould, worm holes, or any defects impairing its strength or durability; to be sawed straight and of full and even length, width and thickness.

BILL OF MATERIAL

- 5000 lineal feet of 2" x 4" spruce in random lengths.
- 19000 F. B. M. of 1" boards 6 inches and up, sized one side and both edges.
- 5000 F. B. M. 3 inch plank 6 inches and up.

Contractors tendering shall state price per thousand feet board measure, for which they will supply the above class of material.
