This day at 4.00 o'clock p. m., His Honor THE HONOURABLE SIR DOUGLAS HAZEN, K.C.M.G., P.C., Administrator of the Government of the Province of New Brunswick came to the Assembly Chamber and being seated on the Throne after assenting to the several bills passed during the session, was pleased to close the session with the following speech:

SPEECH

Mr. Speaker and Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly:—

In bringing the present Session to a close and relieving you from further attendance, I desire to express my appreciation of the diligent attention which you have given to the discharge of your Legislative duties.

In addition to the Acts of a private character which have been passed, you have been asked to consider and have passed important Legislation and measures for the prosperity and good government of the Province. Included in these are: An Act to consolidate and amend the Workmen's Compensation Act, an Act to provide for the transfer of the duties of the New Brunswick Provincial Police to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, An Act to provide for assistance for distribution of electric light and power in rural districts, an Act to amend the Summary Convictions' Act, an Act to amend the Coroners' Act, and an Act to amend the Intoxicating Liquor Act.

I thank you for the provision which you have made for the several important services of the Province.

I now relieve you from your Legislative duties and in bringing this Session to a close, permit me to extend to all of you my earnest wish for your individual happiness and prosperity.
