**Government Notices**

The Honourable The Provincial Secretary-Treasurer Recommends for the Consideration of the Committee of The Executive Council:

That the regulations respecting the incorporation of companies by Letters Patent under the New Brunswick Companies' Act, be amended as follows:

1. The Honourable the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer is hereby designated as the Officer charged with the issue of Letters Patent and Supplementary Letters Patent; and the Department of the Honourable the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer as the Department through which such issue shall take place.

2. The signatures of the subscribers to the Petition for Letters Patent or Supplementary Letters Patent, or to the Memorandum of Association, shall be verified by affidavit to the satisfaction of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer.

3. The following is the Schedule of Fees payable under the 125th Section of the said Act:

When capital stock does not exceed \$5,000	\$ 50.00
Over \$5,000 and not exceeding \$10,000	60.00
Over \$10,000 and not exceeding \$20,000	70.00
Over \$20,000 and not exceeding \$30,000	80.00
Over \$30,000 and not exceeding \$40,000	90.00
Over \$40,000 and not exceeding \$50,000	100.00
Over \$50,000 and not exceeding \$60,000	110.00
Over \$60,000 and not exceeding \$70,000	120.00
Over \$70,000 and not exceeding \$80,000	130.00

On Supplementary Letters, when application is to increase the Capital Stock, the fee shall be payable upon the increased amount for which Letters are applied for, according to the foregoing scale.

In all other cases a fee of \$60.00.

All fees must be paid in cash or by an accepted cheque, payable to the order of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer or Deputy Provincial Secretary-Treasurer, and must be transmitted by Registered Letter.

The fees to be charged upon the incorporation of companies by Letters Patent under the New Brunswick Companies' Act, Section 17 for charitable, philanthropic, temperance, religious, social, political, literary, educational or other like purposes, where there is no capital stock and where the cost value of the real and personal property specified under Section 17, shall be as follows:

Where cost value does not exceed \$1,000.00 a fee of	\$15.00
Over \$1,000.00 and not exceeding \$2,000.00 a fee of	20.00
Over \$2,000.00 and not exceeding \$3,000.00 a fee of	30.00
Over \$3,000.00 and not exceeding \$4,000.00 a fee of	40.00
Over \$4,000.00 and not exceeding \$5,000.00 a fee of	50.00

And for \$5,000.00 and upwards the same fee shall be charged as for trading company. Also that the fee for one insertion in The Royal Gazette of the notice of granting letters patent shall be \$2.20 per square.

The Honourable the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer also recommends that the foregoing amendments take effect from the date hereof and all previous orders and regulations relating thereto be rescinded.

The Honourable The Provincial Secretary-Treasurer Recommends for the Consideration of the Committee of the Executive Council:

That the scales of fees provided in subsections (1) and (5) of section 11 and section 12 of The Theatre Act be repealed and the following substituted in lieu thereof.

11. (1) Every person attending a performance at a theatre and every person attending any place of amusement or participating in any amusement, as mentioned in clause (h) of Section 2 shall upon each admission or attendance or participation where a fee is charged for the same pay to His Majesty for the use of the Province a tax as herein provided and according to the following scale:—

Where the admission fee is not more than Twenty-five Cents, a tax of	.02
Where the fee is more than Twenty-five Cents and not more than Thirty-five Cents, a tax of	.04
Where the fee is more than Thirty-five Cents and not more than Forty Cents, a tax of	.05
Where the fee is over Forty Cents a tax of One Cent additional for each Ten Cents or fraction thereof in excess of Forty Cents.	
Upon each admission on a pass a tax of	.10

(5) The Two Cent Tax mentioned in Sub-section (1) shall not be charged against children, twelve years of age or under, for Saturday afternoon performances.

12. Upon each attendance or participation as aforesaid, where no fee is charged, pay Ten Per Cent of the charge for the meal or refreshment served to such person provided that nothing herein contained shall be construed to include the fees charged on any amusements con-

ducted at any bazaar, picnic, or social held solely for any charitable or religious object.

And the Committee of Council concurring in said recommendation.

The Honourable The Provincial Secretary-Treasurer Recommends for the Consideration of the Committee of the Executive Council:

That the fees payable under Sec. 117, sub-Section 4 of the New Brunswick Companies' Act (called an annual filing fee) of Companies incorporated outside of New Brunswick, be rescinded, and the following substituted in lieu thereof.

When the capital invested and or used in conducting the Companies' Business within the Province of New Brunswick during the past Fiscal Year was \$5000 or under

Exceeding \$5000 but not exceeding \$10,000	\$10.00
Exceeding \$10,000 but not exceeding \$20,000	15.00
Exceeding \$20,000 but not exceeding \$40,000	20.00
Exceeding \$40,000 but not exceeding \$60,000	25.00
Exceeding \$60,000 but not exceeding \$80,000	30.00
Exceeding \$80,000 but not exceeding \$100,000	40.00
Exceeding \$100,000 but not exceeding \$150,000	50.00
Exceeding \$150,000 but not exceeding \$200,000	60.00
Exceeding \$200,000 but not exceeding \$350,000	70.00
Exceeding \$350,000 the fee is 20 cents for every \$1,000 of capital with a maximum fee of	\$250.00

The Honourable the Minister of Public reports for the information of the Committee of the Executive Council:

That the Schedule of fees for Commercial Cars weighing from 3,000 to 4,000 pounds is now \$1.75 per one hundred pounds;

The Honourable the Minister of Public Works now recommends that this section be rescinded and that the rate on commercial cars of over 3,000 pounds and under 4,000 pounds be 1.15 per pound weight for the first 3,000 pounds and \$3.00 for each additional hundred pounds, or fraction thereof, and that this rate be retroactive to January 1st, 1932.

And the Committee of Council concurring in said report and recommendation.

And 5,000 and over a fee of, (per year)	10.00
In an incorporated village or town a fee of, (per year)	5.00
In a city, a fee, (per year)	10.00

**BILL**

An Act to Amend The Corporation Tax Act, Chapter 16, The Revised Statutes, 1927, and to Impose Special Temporary Taxation on Banks and Certain Companies.

Be it enacted by the Administrator of the Government, and the Legislative Assembly, as follows:

1. For the year 1932 there is hereby
