

imposed as a special tax upon all companies transacting any lines of insurance and included in Section 4 of The Corporation Tax Act a special additional assessment of one-half of the tax imposed by said Section 4.

2. For the said year 1932 there is hereby imposed as a special tax upon each bank doing business in the Province upon the average monthly amount of loans, investments, deposits and advances as defined in Section 5 of the said Act at the rate of one-thirtieth of one per centum in addition to the tax imposed by said Act.

3. The Lieutenant-Governor in Council may abate or modify any of the said taxes and may also by order-in-Council extend the provisions of the two preceding sections to the year 1933, but no longer.

HIS HONOUR THE ADMINISTRATOR has been pleased to order that the following amendment to regulations of the New Brunswick Liquor Control Board as passed at a meeting of the said Board held on the 16th day of March, 1932, and assented to by the Chief Commissioner, be approved: "That the numeral '1' in the last line of sub-section (b) of Regulation 13 be struck out and the numeral '5' be inserted in its stead."

The Honourable the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer recommends for the information of the Committee of the Executive Council:

That the fees payable under Section 117, sub-section 4 of the New Brunswick Companies Act (called an annual filing fee) of Companies incorporated under the laws of New Brunswick be rescinded and the following substituted in lieu thereof:

Companies with an authorized capital not exceeding \$5,000\$ 5.00
Exceeding \$5,000, but not exceeding \$10,000 10.00
Exceeding \$10,000, but not exceeding \$20,000 15.00
Exceeding \$20,000, but not exceeding \$40,000 20.00
Exceeding \$40,000 but not exceeding \$60,000 25.00
Exceeding \$60,000, but not exceeding \$80,000 30.00
Exceeding \$80,000, but not exceeding \$100,000 40.00
Exceeding \$100,000, but not exceeding \$150,000 50.00
Exceeding \$150,000, but not exceeding \$200,000 60.00
Exceeding \$200,000, but not exceeding \$350,000 70.00
Companies with authorized capital exceeding \$350,000, the fee is 20 cents for every \$1,000 of capital with a maximum fee of 250.00

When the whole or part of the stock of a Company consists of shares without nominal or par value, each such share shall, for the purpose of ascertaining the fee payable upon such return, be reckoned as having a par value equal to the maximum amount for which a share might be issued or allotted during the year preceding the date of such return, and the total value of all such shares thus ascertained shall be considered as forming the whole or part of the authorized capital, as the case may be.

And the Committee of Council concurring in said report and recommendation. It is accordingly so ordered.

The Honourable the Minister of Public Works reports for the information of the Committee of the Executive Council:

That the fees for Motor Carriers for the Calendar year 1932, be as follows:

"On all Motor Carriers, carrying passengers only, the fee be 2 per cent. of the gross earnings, payable not later than the twentieth of each month for the preceding month's business.

On all Motor carriers carrying freight only, the fee be as follows:

On each and every truck weighing 3,000 pounds or less without load a lump sum of \$25.00.

On each and every truck weighing over 3,000 pounds or less than 4,000 pounds a lump sum of \$50.00.

On each and every truck weighing 4,000 pounds or over a lump sum fee of \$100.00.

Such fee to be payable in advance before a certificate is issued by the Board."

And the Committee of Council concurring in said report and recommendation.

The Honourable The Minister of Public Works reports for the information of the Committee of the Executive Council:

That by Chapter 26 of the Revised Statutes of New Brunswick, 1927, respecting Motor Vehicles, the fees to be paid to the Department are fixed by Schedule A. of said Chapter;

That by Section 29 of said Chapter it is provided that the fees in Schedule A. may be altered from time to time by Order-in-Council;

That the said Schedule A. was altered and amended by Orders-in-Council dated December 11th, 1928 and March 26th, 1931, respectively;

The Honourable the Minister of Public Works now recommends that said Schedule A. may be altered or amended to read as follows:

Registration of Tractor used exclusively for Farm purposes\$ 1.00
Annual Registration fee on a Motor Cycle 1.00
Annual Registration fee on any other Motor Vehicle, including Tractors, Snowmobiles, or machines propelled by their own power on the highway, except Farm Tractors 2.00
For operator's license for person other than a chauffeur to operate a motor vehicle 2.00
Chauffeur's registration fee (Dominion Government employees not exempt) 2.00
Chauffeur's annual tax 2.00
License to conduct a Service, Station or Service and Repair Garage only 5.00
For the transfer of a license on a change of ownership of the licensed garage 2.00
For a Certificate of Registration where there has been a change of ownership 1.00
For a number plate or plates in case of loss 1.00
Each transit marker 1.00
Annual License fee for Tractors used exclusively for Farm purposes. 1.00
Annual License fee for Snowmobiles 1.00
Annual License fee for all other other machines propelled by their own power 5.00
Annual License fee for Motor Cycle with side car 7.00
Annual License fee for each Motor Cycle without side car 5.00
Motor Vehicles, the property of incorporated towns or cities, used exclusively within the limits of such towns or cities, and for Dominion Government owned motor vehicles which are used for Dominion Government purposes only. (This fee is in addition to the annual registration fee of \$2.00). 1.00
Annual License fee for all other Tractors (per 100 lbs.)05
Annual License fee for trailers (Minimum charge, \$5.00), per 100 lbs. carrying capacity.50
Annual License Fee for Motor busses, freight or passenger, at a rate of \$2.25 for each one hundred pounds of weight of vehicle up to 8,000 pounds; at the rate of \$2.75 for each one hundred pounds of weight of vehicle over 8,000 pounds. 20.00
For dealer's license and 2 sets of dealer's number plates, for each county named in license 50.00
Each additional set of dealer's number plates 15.00
For a commercial vehicle equipped

entirely with pneumatic tires at the rate of \$1.15 per one hundred pounds for weight of vehicle up to 3,000 pounds; at the rate of \$1.75 per one hundred pounds for weight of vehicle from 3,000 to 4,000 pounds; at the rate of \$2.00 per one hundred pounds for weight of vehicle from 4,000 to 6,000 pounds; at the rate of \$2.50 per one hundred pounds for weight of vehicle from 6,000 pounds and up. For a Commercial vehicle equipped entirely or in part with other than pneumatic tires at the rate of \$1.75 per one hundred pounds for weight of vehicle up to 3,000 pounds; at the rate of \$2.50 per one hundred pounds for weight of vehicle up to 6,000 pounds; at the rate of \$3.00 per one hundred pounds for weight of vehicle up to or over 8,000 pounds.

Trucks or commercial vehicles entering New Brunswick, which have been duly licensed in their Province or State, the fees to be same as above, but a permit may be given good for one month at one quarter regular rates plus registration fee.

For each Service Crane 25.00

"Service Crane"—a motor truck used by Dealers and Garages, equipped with a hoisting crane, and used for repair work only.

Annual License Fee for all other motor vehicles a sum equal to ninety cents for each one hundred pounds weight or fraction thereof.

The above fees to be retroactive from January 1st, A. D. 1932.

And the Committee of Council concurring in said report and recommendation.
