Re Sale of Extracts in the Parishes of Newcastle and Chatham, County of Northumberland, Province of New Brunswick—

By virtue of a Resolution passed at the regular monthly meeting of The New Brunswick Liquor Control Board, held on the 17th day of August, 1932, the following Order was made:

"Under the authority of Section 53A Sub-section 1 of The Intoxicating Liquor Act The New Brunswick Liquor Control Board herewith orders that no essence, tincture, compound or preparation commonly known or described as a flavoring extract or essence containing alcohol shall be sold in the Parish of Newcastle, including the Town of Newcastle, or the Parish of Chatham, including the Town of Chatham, except in bottles containing not more than two ounces. Such sale shall be limited to one two-ounce bottle per day to any one person. This Order shall become effective on and after October 1st, 1932."
