NEW TIMBER APPLICATIONS

License to expire on the First of Aug. 1933, in accordance with Chapter XI, § George V., 1913, for Saw Mill Licenses of the following application for Timber Berth for the purpose of cutting all classes of lumber, will be sold at this Department on Thursday the 15th day of December, 1932, at noon.

Upset price \$20 per square mile in addition to stumpage.

There is no payment of any bonus required. Licenses are renewable each year by payment of \$8. per square mile and fire tax of \$3.20 per square mile. Stumpage in accordance with the regulations in force and subject to annual change.

All timber, logs or other lumber cut upon unlicensed Crown Land or which may be cut by any person beyond the limits of his own berth, shall be seized and forfeited to the use of the Crown; and no timber or lumber shall be cut on any berth applied for until it shall be purchased at public auction.

**REDUCED STUMPAGE RATES,
LOGGING SEASON 1932-33**

The following reduced rates of stumpage shall take effect as of August 1st, 1932, for the present logging season 1932-33.

For Spruce, Fir, Pine, Haematac, Hemlock, Cedar and Hardwood sawlogs per M. superficial feet to be\$1.60

For Spruce and Fir Logs, when used for pulpwood, per M. superficial feet to be\$2.00

For White Birch Spoolwood per cord .50

For all other classes of lumber stumpage to be one-half less than the rates in effect for 1929-30.

The reduced rates of stumpage referred to above shall not apply to licensees who charge purchasers of timber from their limits a rate of stumpage more than double such reduced rates.
