

duty of all parties seeking to promote the passage of any private Bill to file with the Clerk of the House the evidence of such compliance.

82. In default of such proof or evidence being so furnished, it shall be the duty of the Clerk to report to Mr. Speaker, or the House and to endorse upon the Bill, that the Rules and Standing Orders have not been complied with.

83. No Private or Local Bill shall be received unless it shall be certified by the Deputy Provincial Treasurer upon the Bill, or by certificate annexed thereto, that there has been received into the Provincial Treasury towards the printing and other contingent expenses of the House, the following:

On all original Bills not exceeding one page, \$50.00.

For each additional page or part of a page, \$10.00.

On all amending Bills not exceeding one page, \$30.00.

For each additional page or part of a page, \$10.00.

Upon incorporation of Companies having a stated capital, or amendments increasing capital, an additional fee equal to the fee payable under the N.B. Joint Stock Companies' Act.

A page for the purposes of this Rule, shall mean not exceeding 500 words.

Provided, that when a Bill in respect of which such payment has been made, does not pass the Legislature, it may be introduced at the next following Session upon the payment of an additional sum of \$10.00.

To subscribe for, take up or otherwise acquire by original subscription or otherwise and hold or dispose of shares, stocks, debentures, debenture stock or other securities or obligations of or in any other company and to vote all shares or securities so held.

To distribute in specie or otherwise,

any assets of the Company among its shareholders, and particularly any shares, bonds, debentures or other securities received as the consideration of the sale of the whole or any portion of the property of the Company, or the shares, bonds, debentures or other securities of any other company formed to take over the whole or any part of the assets or liabilities of this Company.
