PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the Legislative Assembly of this Province convened on Thursday, the 25th day of February, last, and continued its Sitting until this day, being the 1st day of April instant, I have thought fit to prorogue the said Legislative Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued accordingly to Thursday the 19th day of May next.

PROCLAMATION

In accordance with the authority given me under Section 42 of Chapter 32 of The Revised Statutes, 1927, all the forest land in the Province of New Brunswick is hereby proclaimed "A Protected Area" in accordance with the following regulations, namely:

(1)—No person shall enter upon any area of forest land, after May 1st, 1932, until November 1st, 1932, for the purpose of travelling, camping or fishing or picnicking or for any other purpose without having first registered with a local fire warden or other person duly authorized giving him name, the route, destination, purpose and duration of the trip with dates, and having obtained a Forest Travel Permit. Such Permit shall be produced when requested by any fire warden or other authorized person provided that the following persons shall not be subject to the above regulations, namely: Licen-

sees or owners or occupiers of the forest lands travelled on, or their employees, or any fire wardens, fire fighters, land surveyors, licensed guides, or persons accompanied by licensed guides, or holders of fishing, fishing, prospecting and mining licenses or leases; or clergyman, teachers, pupils accompanied by Teachers, Scout masters and Scouts when accompanied by Scout Masters.

(2)—Any person who is not required to secure a forest travel permit must when entering or travelling upon forest lands carry an identification card, badge, certificate or license as the case may be, and must exhibit the same and give information with regard to the route, destination, purpose and duration of the trip with dates when so required by any fire warden or other authorized person.

(3)—Any person holding a forest travel permit under Section 43, Chapter 32, The Revised Statutes 1927, or any person exempted by sub-section 3 of Section 42 of the same act, from securing a forest travel permit, who enters or leaves forest lands on roads, trails or other routes of travel where registering stations are provided and designated by notices, issued under authority of the Minister of Lands and Mines as official "Forest Travel Registering Stations" must stop at such places of registration and report to the fire warden or other authorized office there, giving such particulars as are required of the route, destination, purpose and duration of the trip with dates.

Penalties for non-compliance with the above, not less than \$10.00 and not more than \$100.00 or not less than ten and not more than thirty days' imprisonment.

Public Notice is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act" (being Chapter 88 of The Revised Statutes 1927) and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick bearing date the Eighteenth day of April, A. D. 1932, incorporating Douglas Weldon Constantine Stevens, Registered Druggist; Harry Trueman Stevens, Merchant; and F. Dodd Tweedie, Barrister-at-Law; all of the Town of Edmundston, in the County of Madawaska and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase, acquire and take over as a going concern all the stock in trade, fixtures, assets, good-will, business and undertakings heretofore carried on in the Town of Edmundston, aforesaid, and the

Village of Centreville in the County of Carleton, in the name of "Stevens Bros." with all assets and liabilities thereof and to pay for the same in fully paid-up share of the capital stock of "Stevens Bros. Limited."

To carry on business as importers, exporters, manufacturers, wholesale and retail merchants and dealers in drugs, druggists' specialties, medicine, pharmaceutical preparations, toilet articles and requisites, physician's supplies, surgical appliances, dental supplies, proprietary medicines, druggist's supplies and sundries; chemicals and the by-products thereof and all articles of a like nature and all articles entering into the manufacture or composition thereof.

To buy, sell, books, magazines, newspapers, and other periodical publications, stationery, playing cards, novelties, fancy goods, and other articles.

To purchase, manufacture and sell tobacco and the products of tobacco, and such other goods as are usually used and sold in connection therewith.

To manufacture, buy, sell and deal in ice cream, soft drinks, beverages, mineral waters, syrups, confectionery and all articles, preparations and other things used in connection with a general ice cream, soda fountain and confectionery business.

To manufacture, buy, sell and deal in all and every kind of goods, wares, and merchandise of every kind or description necessary or incidental to the business of the company.

To establish, operate and conduct agencies, plants, stores, depots and branches for the sale of all goods and merchandise dealt in by the company in any and all places which may seem fit to the company.

To buy, sell, acquire, hold, register, transfer and dispose of, patent rights, trade-marks and any trade processes, secret or otherwise.

To carry on any other business which may seem to the company capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with its business directly or indirectly to enhance the value or render profitable any of the company's rights.

To act as agents for traders, dealers and manufacturers of any goods, wares or merchandise of the nature or description herein before mentioned.

To purchase, take on lease or exchange, hire or acquire any real or personal property or any rights which, to the company, may seem fit and necessary for the purpose of its business.

To buy, sell, acquire, hold and transfer the shares of any other company or corporation or interest in any partnership, carrying on business similar to that of the company, by the name of "Stevens Bros. Limited" with a capital stock of Thirty Thousand Dollars divided into Three Hundred Shares of One Hundred Dollars Each, with the head office at the Town of Edmundston in the County of Madawaska and Province of New Brunswick.
