We have received nothing since our last regarding that intelligence which all persons are now so anxiously expecting—the fate of the Roman Catholic Relief Bill in the House of Lords. If the Press, however, be any indication of the state of public feeling on this great question; and surely it is (as at all times upon all others) in the last and most powerful degree; there is considerable room to apprehend, that if the advocates for the measure should be gratified by the ultimate result; those against it (and the odds, if true, are fearfully in favor of the latter, at least in England,) would not. And, therefore, while every truly good man, of whatever sect or denomination, cannot but devoutly wish for the general happiness and welfare of his suffering and deserving fellow creatures, (if the room in Ireland have, indeed, any actual interest in this matter;) it would undoubtedly be a source of grief to many, if it were so to fall out, that in striving to emancipate (as the term is) one body of individuals, another, who consider themselves deeply interested in this question, should not be conciliated at the same time. The situation of the Premier, at a crisis of such a nature, is, beyond all doubt, a most trying and difficult one.

The St. George Steam Boat arrived here from St. John, for the first time this Season, on Wednesday morning last.

His Grace the Duke of Northumberland had arrived in Dublin, where he was received with distinguished honors, and sworn in Lord-Lieutenant of Ireland.

HALIFAX, April 25.

We have been this morning favored with a New York paper brought by the Callao—the following being the only important intelligence which it contained:—Recorder.

**SOUTH AMERICA.**—The arrival of the Hon. W. H. Harrison as United States Envoy, at Bogota, has given much satisfaction.—**Popayan.**—An express has arrived at head quarters announcing the dispersion and destruction of the guerillas in that district.—In despatches to the Liberator Bolivar, it is related, that the Peruvian maritime forces have forced the chain which crossed the River of Guayaquil, burnt part of the fortifications and bombarded the town, but by the valour of the besieged, had to withdraw, after suffering severely. The traitor pilot who offered his services to the hostile Admiral, getting the ship on shore, was immediately put to death. The Admiral fell in a subsequent engagement. Bolivar is represented as being on the eve of joining Colombia against Peru.

The Squaw brought in the master and six of the crew of the brig William, of St. John, N. B. Thos. Ogilvey, master; which vessel left Liverpool, 22d March, sprung a leak Long. 30 1-2, was abandoned on the 3d of April, crew taken on board of a small French brig bound to the banks of Newfoundland to fish, next day master and half the people were taken on board the Brig Elizabeth, of Estu, bound to Prince Edward Island, out of which vessel they were taken by the Squaw.—**Novascotian.**
