His Excellency Sir Howard Douglas, accompanied by his Aides-de-Camp and the Honorable Thomas Baillie, left the seat of Government for England between 9 and 10 o'clock on Wednesday morning last, according to an intimation which appeared in the Royal Gazette, the preceding day.

On the occasion of His Excellency's departure, the coloured Inhabitants of Fredericton, conveyed their grateful acknowledgements to His Excellency, (through a respectable person of colour,) for the many kind and liberal benefits which His Excellency and family had conferred upon them, and especially for the formation of an Institution, through the exertions of His Excellency, from which their children can derive the great blessings of a moral and religious education.

His Excellency, in substance, cordially assured the person alluded to, that he was happy in receiving this testimony of the grateful remembrances of the coloured Inhabitants of Fredericton, for what he had been able to do towards the promotion of their welfare; assuring them of his best wishes, and trusting they would not be slothful in profiting by the advantages which he was gratified to hear they so highly and so justly valued.

Three very interesting Documents under the American Head, will be found in this impression.

BAKER'S CASE.—The Senate of the United States have discharged the Committee on Foreign relations, from the further consideration of this subject, and referred the papers connected therewith back to the President. The following is from the Congressional Report of the proceedings of the 18th inst.

Mr. TAZEVELL, from the Committee of Foreign Resolutions, moved that said Committee be discharged from the further consideration of the petition and papers of John Baker, and that the same be referred to the President of the United States, which motion was decided in the affirmative. —*N. Y. Albion, February 28.*

We understand that the House of Assembly, as recommended by a Committee, of which Mr. CHRISTIE was Chairman, has in justice to the County of GASPE, which he represented, voted the sum of 1150*l.* for opening roads in that County, as well as the sum of 3000*l.* recommended by the Committee on internal communications, for opening a road between RISTIGOUCHE and METIS. This latter road, when finished, will open a communication with NOVA SCOTIA via NEW-BRUNSWICK. This circumstance, it is obvious, must be highly gratifying to Mr. CHRISTIE and the friends of the County of GASPE. —*Quebec Official Gazette, Feb. 26.*
