On the ground of this assertion, give me leave, Gentlemen, to dissuade you from being discouraged by A the disappointment which your society experienced W at the commencement of its career,-a disappointment which subjected the plans of your Committee ful to a temporary derangement, but which I hope will tio ultimately prove beneficial. With respect to our becoming auxiliary to the County Society, you have my decided disapprobation, until some channel is opened whereby a proportional part of the pecuniary aid granted to that institution, may flow directly, and without diminution, to all its branches. Besides, I can hardly conceive it possible for you to form an alliance with an institution so dissimilar to your own, without being compelled to make such concessions as shall be an infringement of those equitable laws, which form the mei basis of your Society.
