HE First Number of a Periodical bearing the above title, will appear on or about June 1st .- Some of the reasons which induce its publication, are, a wish to accord with the advice of several persons who have expressed an opinion on the subject ;-a knowledge that while Halifax has six vehicles for its politics, news, and business, it has not one for its literature ;and a confidence that the metropolis of Nova Scotia could well support one for the latter purpose, if one

The Publishers of the HALIFAX MONTHLY MAGAseem adverse. - One of these circumstances is, the failure of two former provincial monthly periodicals; another is, the supposed impossibility of giving a literary work of merit, in a young country, at a suitable rate for extensive circulation. The first objection may be answered by saying that the "Nova Scotta Magazine" was published, and was discontinued, when the Province had not arrived at more than half its present importance: the publication consisted chiefly of re-printed matter. The "Acadian Magazine" was an attempt to blend originality with miscellaneous selections; but from untoward arrangements and circumstances, those most concerned have allowed, that the work was not deserving of greater public support than it obtained. The Halifax Monthly purposes to be entirely filled with original articles; and is attempted at a time, and under arrangements, which are thought favourable. It will be totally dissimilar to the "Nova-Scotia Magazine," that was a repository for the gleanings of European fields; the work now proposed, will has nothing in common with the "Acadian Magazine," partment was allowed to be the best filled in that esmerit—the terms of the Halifax Monthly Magazine will be One Shilling per Monthly Number, of Forty pages; the originality of the entire matter will answer for the attention which must be paid it; its mer-

it can only be pleaded by an appearance of itself. The Publisher would suggest that the Newspaper press, being chiefly devoted to politics, news, controversies, notices, selections, and advertisements, does not at all preclude the necessity of a Magazine—the use of the latter he imagines to be for the publication of the more lengthy, studied, and abstracted productions, generally classed under the heads Critical and Literary. The heads comprise REVIEW, Essay, Poetry, Tale, Sketch, &c. With this view it may appear that the Newspaper press instead of militating against a literary work, is the natural precurser, the school master, which prepares the way, and calls it forth. Their energies, though having the one foundation and intent, are very dissimilar in action; they are calculated to be of mutual benefit; and both have their existence in what each greatly promotes-the intelligence and spirit of the Community.

A Monthly Magazine if not pledged to be original, is in great danger of becoming a mere re-print of property belonging to other works. It has not the right, nor the necessity to copy, which the Newspaper has; and when it depends on such subsistence, it at once fails to be, what it should be at the present day—a vehicle to foster, correct, and demonstrate home talent.
