



LEGISLATURE OF NEW-BRUNSWICK.
(EXTRACTS FROM THE JOURNALS.)

Thursday, 17th March.
To His Honor the President or Commander in Chief, the sum of 50l. to defray the expenses of a Courier from Newcastle to Fredericton.

To the Honorable Richard Simonds, the sum of 600l. for his services from the 31st December, 1829, to 31st December, 1830; and a further sum of 100l. to enable him to pay a Clerk for the same period.

To His Majesty's Attorney General, the sum of 100l. for his services for the year 1830.

To His Majesty's Solicitor General, for his services for the year 1830, the sum of 50l.

To the Clerk of the Crown in the Supreme Court, for his services for the year 1831, the sum of 100l.

To Daniel Smith, a settler on the Quaco road, the sum of 3l. 13s. being the amount due to him as the Provincial Bounty for Grain raised upon new land, he having produced the requisite certificate and proof to the Court of General Sessions of the Peace, for the City and County of Saint John, but which was neglected in consequence of but few applications having been made.

Saturday, 19th March.

The House went into Committee of the whole, on the Reports from the Provincial Auditor, on the Accounts from Supervisors of Great Roads, and passed the following resolutions, viz :—

Resolved, That the Accounts of George Anderson, Supervisor of that part of the Great Road from St. John to St. Andrews, commencing at Saint John and ending at Magaguadavic, are satisfactory.

Resolved, That the Accounts of B. L. Peters, Supervisor of part of the Great Road from Saint John to the Nova Scotia Line, are satisfactory; except in the charge of Commission; which should have been made on the sum expended instead of the amount granted; making, therefore, the proper deduction; the balance due Mr. Peters is 8l. 9s. 8d.

Resolved, That the accounts of Thomas Wyer, Supervisor of that part of the Great Road from Saint John to Saint Andrews leading from Magaguadavic to the latter place, appear to the Committee satisfactory.

Resolved, That the accounts of E. G. N. Scovill, Supervisor of part of the Great Road leading from Saint John to the Nova Scotia Line, are unsatisfactory.

Resolved, That the accounts of the Hon. William Botsford, late Supervisor of part of the Great Road leading from the Saint John to the Nova Scotia Line, are correct and satisfactory. The sum of 19l. 11s. 3d. in his hands, from expenditures on the Great Marsh in Westmorland, remains to be accounted for.

Resolved, That the accounts of Edwin Botsford, Supervisor of part of the Great Road leading from Saint John to the Nova Scotia line, are correct and satisfactory.

Resolved, That the accounts of Joseph Reed, Supervisor of the Great Road from Newcastle to Restigouche, are satisfactory.

Resolved, That the accounts of Alexander Goodfellow, Supervisor of the Great Road from Chatham to Richibucto, are satisfactory; except the charges for tavern bills and ferriages, and the Commission on the same; adding these overcharges, 15l. 11s. to the amount stated to be in his hand, 17l. 10s. 7d., the balance in favor of the Province is 137l. 1s. 7d.

Resolved, That the accounts of Robert Doak, Supervisor of the Great Road from Fredericton to Newcastle, are extremely extravagant, and consequently wholly inadmissible; and in the opinion of this Committee, this House should address His Honor the President, praying that he will dismiss the said Supervisor from his office forthwith.

And further resolved, that unless the said Robert Doak do furnish to this House within ten days after the opening of the next Session, satisfactory accounts and vouchers for the expenditure of the whole amounts entrusted to him for the improvement of the above-mentioned road, that His Majesty's Attorney General be directed to commence legal proceedings, for the recovery of the sums so entrusted.

And the Chairman further reported, that he was directed to ask leave to sit again.

Ordered, That the report be accepted, and leave granted.

The House went into Committee of the whole, in further consideration of Supplies to be granted for the Public Service, and passed the following resolutions, viz.

Resolved, That there be granted to the Master in Chancery, appointed to carry Messages for the Council to the House of Assembly for the present Session, the sum of 40l.

To William Kennedy of Saint Stephens, in the County of Charlotte, the sum of 10l. to assist him in the support of himself and family; being very aged and indigent, and having served his Country faithfully, during the revolutionary war.

To His Honor the President or Commander in Chief, the sum of 80l. to enable him to pay the Trustees of Schools for the Parish of Fredericton, for four Schools taught in that Parish during the year 1830, by Female Teachers, duly licensed, as certified to His Honor, by the Court of General Sessions of the Peace.

To the Governor and Trustees of the Madras School in New-Brunswick, for the year 1831, the sum of 400l. towards the support of that institution throughout the Province.

To Doctor John Boyd, Innoculating Surgeon of the Vaccine Institution, the sum of 20l. for the year 1830.

To His Honor the President or Commander in Chief, a sum not exceeding 100l. to be applied by him in rewarding persons for the apprehension of deserters from His Majesty's land forces within the Province: Provided always, that no greater sum be paid for the apprehension of any one deserter than five pounds.

And that the Chairman further reported, that in the Committee it was moved, that there be granted,

To His Honor the President or Commander in Chief, a sum not exceeding 500l. to be applied as an encouragement to Sealing Voyages from this Province; so much of the sum as may be required to be paid to the first vessels which shall be properly fitted out, and shall prosecute such sealing voyage; and after the rate of twenty shillings for each and every ton, which such vessel shall admeasure, agreeably to their register, to the extent of five hundred tons of such registered tonnage. Such encouragement or bounty to be paid by warrant of the President or Commander in Chief, upon the certificate of the Treasurer or any Deputy Treasurer, at the Port or Place where such vessel or vessels may be fitted out; that the vessel for which such bounty shall be claimed, is wholly owned by a resident or residents within this Province; was properly fitted for a sealing voyage, and manned with at least one man to every four tons or registered tonnage, and equipped with one boat to every four men; which certificate shall also be accompanied with an affidavit of the Master of such vessel, and at least one half of the crew; that such vessel was actually employed in prosecuting such sealing voyage; and that such vessel had actually taken seals; and that the whole of the skins and oil of such seals, had been actually landed in the Province; and were wholly the property of one or more British subject or subjects resident within the same.

Whereupon, the Committee divided as follows :—
