Province stands prorogued to the first

Monday in December next: I have thought

Assembly, and the same is hereby pro-

rogued to Thursday, the nineteenth day of

January next ensuing, then to meet at Fre-

dericton for the despatch of business.

MILITIA GENERAL ORDER.

IT is with much regret that the Lieutenant-

Governor and Commander-in-Chief ob-

serves, from the Inspection Return, that such

a number of the Officers so frequently absent

themselves from the Parades of their respective

Corps, without assigning any cause for such ab-

sence; a conduct highly reprehensible, not only

as being subversive of all discipline, but as affor-

ding the most pernicious example to the men

under their command.

When the Commander in Chief considers

that the Officers of the Militia ought solely to

be impelled to the performance of their Militia

duty by honor and patriotism, he cannot allow

himself to think that this neglect proceeds from

any idea that they are not punishable by Law,

particularly when they seriously reflect upon the

solemn pledge they make to their Country, by

accepting their Commissions, of rendering

themselves efficient defenders of it, when it

may be found necessary to call upon them.

He therefore feels it his duty to remind them

that this cannot be effected but by their acquiring,

in the first place, a knowledge of their own du-

ties, and then by a zealous and unwearied at-

tention, to instruct those who have been placed

under their command.

The Commander-in-Chief being deeply im-

pressed with the importance of this natural Na-

tional Defence, is determined to use his unremit-

ting endeavours to render it as efficient as possi-

ble, and calls upon the Officers, cordially to co-

operate with him in effecting this most desira-

ble object; and therefore trusts that he shall

not, in future, be under the disagreeable neces-

sity of animadverting upon any inattention to

duty.

The Commander in Chief takes this opportu-

nity of expressing the high satisfaction he feels,

at the great zeal and most laudable conduct of

the Officers and Men of many of the Corps, as

stated in the report of the late General Inspec-

tion; and doubts not, that they will persevere

in so honorable a course, and assures them that

he duly appreciates such loyalty and zeal, and

that he will spare no pains in his power to re-

23. In lieu of the Fees heretofore paid for the

Survey of the ground applied for, the sum of

three pence per ton on Timber, and sixpence per

thousand on superficial feet on sawed Lumber,

will be required with the tonnage, to meet the

expense of the Survey; and in estimating the

quantity of boards to be paid for, three Pine

Logs of eighteen feet in length will be reckoned

to the thousand.

4th. No Timber or Logs shall be cut before

the Licence has issued, and the boundaries of the

Birth are defined, and all the Timber or Logs

cut contrary to this Regulation will be seized,

and the offenders will in addition be prosecuted

without discrimination for trespass and intru-

sion on the Crown Lands.

5th. All Timber and Logs found without the

Mark mentioned in the Licence shall be seized

and any person having a Licence and being

found in possession of more Timber marked

with his mark than is expressed in his Licence,

the whole will be seized, and the offender pro-

secuted, unless he shall make it appear that it

was cut on private property.

6th. The party will be required to mark on

each stick of Timber its number and contents,

and to keep a Register of the same in the

Camp, for the information of the Officer, and

any stick found without such number and mark

will be liable to seizure.

7th. The mark indorsed on the Licence must

be distinctly placed within triangles on three

sides of the stick, near both ends, and all pri-

vate marks must be placed near the centre of

the stick. Nov. 23d.
