Copy of a Circular addressed to the Deputy Commissioners and Surveyors through the Province.

### CROWN LAND OFFICE,

Federicton, 6th Aug. 1832.  
Sir,—For the information of His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, I have to request that you will immediately furnish me with a list of the number of persons within the District assigned to your charge, who have, without proper authority, taken possession of certain portions of Crown Land, and made improvements thereon.

In framing your Report you will state the extent and value of the improvements made by the parties, the number and value of their Stock, and also their ability to purchase from the Crown such a quantity of land, comprising their clearances, as may be sufficient to make them a farm, it being the intention of the Lieutenant Governor to deal leniently with those persons who shall, after being notified, make immediate application to purchase the land on which they may reside.

You may at the same time inform all persons so situated that in default of immediate application being made for permission to purchase the lands in question, the Attorney General will be directed to proceed against them according to Law.
