HIS Majesty's Government having de-
termined to collect the Quit Rents
on the Granted Lands in this Province.
Notice is hereby given, by order of His
Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, that
His Majesty is graciously pleased to re-
mit all Quit Rents due previously to Mid-
summer day last, but that they will be
strictly enforced from that period.

With the view, however, of giving every
encouragement to Persons desirous of
commuting them, they will be permitted
to redeem them on the following Terms:

At Sixteen Years purchase to all Per-
sons who may redeem them before Mid-
summer day 1834.

At Eighteen Years purchase to those
Persons who may redeem them subse-
quently to that period, and anterior to Mid-
summer 1836.

And at Twenty Years purchase, to
those Persons who may commute them
subsequently to Midsummer 1836, with
an intimation, however, that His Majes-
ty's Government will then take into con-
sideration how far it may be expedient
to dispose of the unredeemed Quit Rents
to any Persons desirous of purchasing
them on the principle adopted in England
with regard to the Land Tax.
