## A PROCLAMATION.

sembly of this Province stands  
prorogued to Tuesday the Twen-  
ty-third Day of October instant, I  
have thought fit further to pro-  
rogue the said General Assembly,  
and the same is hereby prorogued,  
to the third Tuesday in December  
next.
